The Clewiston City Commission held its regular meeting in the City Hall Commission Chambers on Monday, April 15, 2024. The meeting was called to order at 5:00 p.m. by Mayor James Pittman. Mayor Pittman gave the invocation and the audience joined in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

### PUBLIC HEARINGS

2. Ordinance No. 2024-04 – PUBLIC HEARING - Final Reading – 5:05 p.m. – Ordinance No. 2024-04 abandons and vacates the alley, located in Block 424 of the General Plan of Clewiston, Florida, as revised, located and lying between Lots 1-44.

Mayor Pittman read Ordinance No. 2024-04 by title, opened the public hearing and asked for public comments. There were no comments from the public. Commissioner Hyslope recommended the Commission use extra caution when abandoning alleys so as not to create useless space. After a brief discussion, Mayor Pittman closed the public hearing.

Commissioner Edmonds made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Gardner, to approve Ordinance No. 2024-04. Vote 5 yeas, 0 nays

3. Ordinance No. 2024-05 – PUBLIC HEARING - Final Reading – 5:05 p.m. - Ordinance No. 2024-05 abandons and vacates its interest in that portion of Haiti Avenue, located between Block 414 & 413 of the General Plan of Clewiston, Florida, as revised, subject to utility & access easement(s) to be maintained along the entire length of the existing easement.

Mayor Pittman read Ordinance No. 2024-05 by title, opened the public hearing and asked for public comments. There were no comments from the public. Commissioner Gardner noted that this property has never been used as a roadway. Mayor Pittman closed the public hearing.

Commissioner Gardner made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Hyslope, to approve Ordinance No. 2024-05. Vote 5 yeas, 0 nays

Change Order No. 12, subject to FDOT approval, for additional construction related services to complete project details not included in the original scope but necessary to address specific needs for the Bridge Over C-21 Canal Project.

Mayor Pittman read Resolution No. 2024-024 by title and asked for public comments. There were no public comments.

Commissioner Gardner made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Hyslope, to approve Resolution No. 2024-024. Vote 5 yeas, 0 nays

**6. Resolution No. 2024-025** – Resolution No. 2024-025 approves Change Order No. One to Tetra Tech Work Order No. Two for the Ventura Avenue Road Resurfacing Design.

Mayor Pittman read Resolution No. 2024-025 by title and asked for public comments. Consulting Engineer Dave Trouteaud commented on the project and how the roundabout caused more survey and drainage design needs.

Commissioner Hyslope made a motion, seconded by Vice Mayor Thompson, to approve Resolution No. 2024-025. Vote 4 yeas, 1 nay (Commissioner Gardner voted nay and expressed that she felt we should show the plans to the area businesses and churches first.)

7. **Resolution No. 2024-026** – Resolution No. 2024-026 approves Change Order No. Two to the C-21 Canal Construction Engineering Inspection (CEI) Services Agreement with Stantec Consulting Service, Inc. (Stantec).

Mayor Pittman read Resolution No. 2024-026 by title. Engineer Trouteaud explained that this change order was supposed to be in conjunction with the Item 4 change order that was pulled. He stated that they were waiting on a final cost estimate from Zep Construction and will come back to the Commission to finalize that resolution, which will coincide with this change order with Stantec for additional inspection fees. He confirmed that all of these funds are within the existing project. He stated that at the previous meeting, they discussed doing the parking lot and the Herbert Hoover dike access road at the same time but it now looks like the scope was too much for the existing budget so the scope was reduced to just the parking lot with the hope of doing the Herbert Hoover dike access road project under the SCOP grant in the future. It was confirmed that Commissioner Gardner's concern regarding the traffic pattern was addressed when the parking was adjusted.

Vice Mayor Thompson made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Gardner, to approve Resolution No. 2024-026. Vote 5 yeas, 0 nays

### MISCELLANEOUS ACTION AND DISCUSSION ITEMS

8. Appointments/Re-appointments to the Community Redevelopment Advisory Board

Commissioner Gardner made a motion, seconded by Vice Mayor Thompson, to table this item to the next meeting and reach out to the three existing board members to make sure they want to continue serving. Vote 5 yeas, 0 nays

9. Interim City Manager Salary Discussion

Commissioner Hyslope suggested using a stipend format as she wanted to make sure they were being fair. Mayor Pittman explained the previous interim manager's salaries were adjusted for the time they were acting in that capacity and then their salary was re-adjusted once a city manager was hired. He suggested an annual salary of \$170,000, which is what the previous city manager was hired at. Commissioner Hyslope stated that she would like to

see it a little higher. Commissioner Gardner stated that the average of the top three from the attached survey is \$181,799.33.

Vice Mayor Thompson made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Gardner, to pay the interim city manager \$180,000 for the next 12 months and to be renegotiated after that.

Vice Mayor Thompson withdrew his motion and made a new motion, seconded by Commissioner Gardner, to pay the interim city manager \$180,000 for the next 12 months or until another city manager is determined. Vote 5 yeas, 0 nays

## 9A. Consideration of authorizing City Attorney to retain labor counsel as needed on behalf of the city

Attorney Brandenburg stated that the City received a representation petition from the Fraternal Order to represent the City's police department. It will go in front of the Public Employees Relations Commission (PERC). He recommended the City retain a specialty labor counsel for actual collective bargaining negotiations and things like that on the city's behalf. He stated that he reached out to three firms that he believed were qualified and able to handle the work and recommended going with the lowest bid from Lara Donlon of Torcivia, Donlon, Goddeau & Rubin, P.A. He stated that he believed the initial hearing with PERC has been scheduled for May 16, 2024. Vice Mayor Thompson suggested a workshop be scheduled to discuss the process. Attorney Brandenburg explained that PERC is an administrative agency that is responsible for any labor organizations that want to operate within the state and have to register with that agency. If they are seeking to create a new bargaining unit or represent a new group of employees, you have to file through PERC to do that. The agency is also responsible for a number of other functions involving public employees. Commissioner Gardner requested a timeline on this process at the workshop.

Mayor Pittman asked Attorney Brandenburg to reach out to Alley and Alley who worked for the city before on other labor issues. Attorney Brandenburg stated that he is requesting action from the board to pursue representation and would like to get this referred out to labor counsel. He suggested the Commission choose Laura Donlon as a backup.

Commissioner Hyslope made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Gardner, to authorize the City Attorney to retain Alley & Alley as labor counsel on behalf of the City as needed and if they are unavailable or unwilling to retain Laura Donlon with the firm of Torcivia, Donlon, Goddeau & Rubin, P.A. Vote 5 yeas, 0 nays

Before the vote, Attorney Brandenburg stated that he would like permission to engage the counsel because the hearing is coming up. He clarified the engagement would be as needed for the sole purpose of this issue. The workshop was scheduled for April 29, 2024 at 3:00 p.m.

Vice Mayor Thompson stated that he was glad that all of the employees of the year were here tonight to be recognized. Mayor Pittman agreed.

### CITY OF CLEWISTON Special Commission Meeting April 29, 2024

The City of Clewiston City Commission held a Special Commission Meeting in the City Hall Commission Chambers Monday, April 29, 2024. The meeting was called to order at 3:00 p.m. by Mayor Pittman. Mayor Pittman gave the invocation. Hatton Kurtz led the audience in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

<u>Commissioners Present</u>: Mayor James Pittman, Vice Mayor Greg Thompson, Commissioner Mali Gardner and Commissioner Hillary Hyslope. Commissioner Barbara Edmonds was absent.

<u>Personnel Present</u>: Interim City Manager Danny Williams, Assistant Utilities Director Lynne Mila, Fire Chief/Community Development Director Travis Reese, IT Administrator J.D. Lucas, Police Chief Tom Lewis, Police Sergeant Demetrius Scruggs, Consulting Engineer David Trouteaud and City Attorney Dylan Brandenburg.

Visitors Present: Laura Donlon, Hatton Kurtz, Daylen Moss, Lisa Walker and Jerry Cochrane.

Additions/Deletions/Changes and Approval of the Agenda – There were no additions, deletions or changes to the agenda.

**Public Comments** – Clewiston Christian School National Honor Society Students Hatton Kurtz and Daylen Moss commented on the leadership positions they hold at Clewiston Christian School and the ways they give back to the community.

### MISCELLANEOUS ACTION AND DISCUSSION ITEMS

1. Police Department Representation Petition Discussion - City Attorney Brandenburg reported that John-Edward Alley, the labor attorney previously used by the City, has retired and was not available, so Laura Donlon of Torcivia, Donlon, Goddeau and Rubin, P.A. was retained as the City's labor attorney to represent the city with regard to this labor petition. He then introduced Attorney Laura Donlon. She provided an overview of the process and stated that a request for an extension to file a response to the end of this month will be filed. She stated that one of the main issues the hearing officer is looking into is whether or not the rank of sergeant belongs in the same unit as patrol officers because they have previously determined that sergeants have a supervisory conflict with the patrol officers. She noted that if it is determined the sergeants would not be included, the sergeants could file a petition for a separate bargaining unit on their own. She also noted that the concerns that triggered the petition are not known at this time. She suspected a decision about the unit would be made within 30 to 45 days unless a hearing is necessary. She then explained that shade meetings for collective bargaining are completely exempt from the Sunshine Law and can only be held once we are engaged for collective bargaining.

Mr. Jerry Cochrane expressed that he feels the Commission should not oppose this election petition as they will have the ultimate control. He encouraged the Commission to be fair and negotiate with them.

### RESOLUTIONS

2. Resolution No. 2024-019 – Resolution No. 2024-019 approves Zep Construction, Inc. Change Order No. 12, subject to FDOT approval, for additional construction related services to complete project details not included in the original scope but necessary to address specific needs for the Bridge Over C-21 Canal Project.

Mayor Pittman read Resolution No. 2024-019 by title. Interim Manager Williams commented on the scope of this change order.

Commissioner Gardner made a motion, seconded by Vice Mayor Thompson, to approve Resolution No. 2024-019. Vote 4 yeas, 0 nays (Commissioner Edmonds was absent.)

**3. Resolution No. 2024-027** — Resolution No. 2024-027 approves the contract for financial assistance between the City of Clewiston and Florida Rural Water Association (FRWA) for Lead Service Line Inventory assistance.

Mayor Pittman read Resolution No. 2024-027 by title. Interim Manager Williams stated that this work will be funded by FRWA who will hire a contractor that will work with Johnson Engineering and will evaluate our waterlines. Consulting Engineer Trouteaud commented on the process and explained that the inventory is required and is administered through the Department of Environmental Protection. He stated that Johnson Engineering is also working with the City of Cape Coral on their inventory process. Assistant Utilities Director Lynne Mila commented on how AMI program will help with finding the meters for this process.

Commissioner Hyslope made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Gardner, to approve Resolution No. 2024-027. Vote 4 yeas, 0 nays (Commissioner Edmonds was absent.)

**4. Resolution No. 2024-028** – Resolution No. 2024-028 authorizes the Mayor to execute an agreement between the City of Clewiston and the YMCA of Southwest Florida, Inc. to Operate Summer Camp, which agreement provides for summer camp programs to children ages 5 to 12 years old.

Mayor Pittman read Resolution No. 2024-028 by title. Interim Manager Williams confirmed that this year's program will be the same program that was offered last year and the year before.

Vice Mayor Thompson made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Hyslope, to approve Resolution No. 2024-028. Vote 4 yeas, 0 nays (Commissioner Edmonds was absent.)

5. Resolution No. 2024-029 – Resolution No. 2024-029 approves the re-appointment of Scott Jones and the appointments of Ramon L. Carroll, Kersten Maxson and Lisa Walker to the Community Redevelopment Advisory Board (CRAB).

Mayor Pittman read Resolution No. 2024-029 by title.

Vice Mayor Thompson made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Gardner, to approve Resolution No. 2024-029. Vote 4 yeas, 0 nays (Vice Mayor Edmonds was absent.)

**Resolution No. 2024-030** – Resolution No. 2024-030 approves revisions to the Employee Classification Document for the Recreation and Administration and Finance Departments.

Mayor Pittman read Resolution No. 2024-030 by title. Interim Manager Williams explained that we are adding an employee to the HR division who will split duties with recreation director. The job title will be Recreation Director/Human Resources and someone else will be Director of Programs. He noted that he is also looking at hiring a contractor for the ballfields and is working with a couple of consultants on pricing. The current consultant is now paid out of the golf course budget.

Vice Mayor Thompson made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Gardner, to approve Resolution No. 2024-030. Vote 4 yeas, 0 nays (Commissioner Edmonds was absent.)

Manager Williams reported that the new finance director started working today. He stated that we are losing Finance Director Shari Howell who did an awesome job. He noted that he is also working on filling the finance specialist position and confirmed that we are looking at Indeed for advertising our open positions.

Attorney Brandenburg provided an update on the Clewiston Commons case. He reported that it's still proceeding in federal court. The judge recently ruled on the City's motion for summary judgment on four the five remaining counts and approved removing those counts from the complaint. There is one remaining count currently in federal court. He noted the order is appealable. We will be submitting another summary judgment motion on the remaining claim and if it is not removed, it will proceed to trial at some point later on this year.

Interim Manager Williams reported that the smart meters will be done Wednesday other than a few big meters that we will contract out. Commissioner Gardner mentioned that she was impressed with the professionalism of the contractor that came to change her meter.

### Adjournment

Mayor Pittman declared the meeting adjourned with unanimous consensus of the members present at 3:51 p.m.

### Hendry County Library Cooperative Policies

### **Internet Access Policy**

PURPOSE: To establish guidelines for library staff and library users in the use and dissemination of electronic information through the internet and to inform the public of the Library's policy for internet access.

POLICY: The internet offers access to a global network of millions of computers across more than 190 countries and links to the exchange of data, news and opinions that can be useful and appropriate for individuals of all ages. It is, however, an unregulated medium with a highly diverse user population. Providing information through the internet is not the same as selecting and purchasing materials for the Library's collection. Some information provided through the internet may not meet the Library's selection criteria or guidelines. Information on the internet may be reliable and current or it may be inaccurate, out-of-date, or incomplete. The Library cannot monitor or control the vast amount of material accessible through the internet.

The internet may contain material of a controversial nature. It is the responsibility of users to determine what information is appropriate for their own use. It is the responsibility of parents and legal guardians to determine what information is appropriate for their children. As with other library materials, parents and legal guardians are encouraged to monitor and supervise their children's internet use.

Internet access is available at Library locations through designated public computers and is also available through the Library's free public wireless (WiFi) access. An adult, teen or child needs a current Hendry County library card to use a computer in library at all locations.

In accordance with the Children's Internet Protection Act (CIPA) the Library's computers and wireless connection are filtered to block internet access to visual depictions that are obscene, contain child pornography, or are harmful to minors. Content filters are never perfectly accurate. Parents or legal guardians retain the right and responsibility to determine what use is appropriate for their child.

### Responsibility of Users

The Library encourages users to be responsible and considerate of others when using computers in a public setting. Parents and legal guardians are responsible for determining what information is appropriate for themselves and their children. Disregarding the following guidelines may result in loss of computer privileges, potential loss of library privileges, and possible prosecution:

The Library's computer equipment and software must be used as installed. Users are not allowed to delete, add to, or change the installed hardware or software.

Users may not use the Library's computers or wireless connection to obtain unauthorized access, including hacking, into any other computer or network, or participate in other unlawful online activities.

Users may not disrupt or interfere with other computer or network users, services, or equipment. Intentional disruption of the operation of computer systems and networks is a violation of Florida Statutes, Chapter 815, and users may be held responsible.

Users may not represent themselves as another person or use internet access to transmit obscene, threatening, or harassing materials.

Users may not send or display obscene materials or materials harmful to minors in accordance with Florida Statutes, Chapter 847.

Users must respect the legal protection of data and software provided by copyright and license law.

Users should be aware of computer viruses and other destructive computer programs, and take steps to avoid being a victim or unwitting distributor of these problems. All wireless access users should have upto-date virus protection on their laptop computers or wireless devices. The Library will not be responsible for any information that is compromised, or for any damage caused to hardware or software due to electric surges, security issues or consequences caused by viruses or hacking. The Library cannot guarantee that a personal device brought into the Library will work with the Library's wireless network.

Users of electronic mail (email) systems or other forms of direct electronic communications should be aware that these communications may not be secure and are extremely vulnerable to unauthorized access and modification. Parents and guardians should instruct children on using these types of communication safely and to refrain from disclosing personal information online.

The unauthorized disclosure, use and dissemination of personal identification information regarding children is prohibited.

For security reasons, users may not install or download applications on the hard drive of a Library computer. Copying to a removable USB device or removable media is permitted.

Users should ensure they save or print their work prior to the end of their computer session to prevent loss of data. The Library cannot retrieve and is not responsible for the loss of data.

The library is not responsible for the disclosure, loss, misuse or inappropriate distribution of private information left on public computers as a result of the computer being unattended or personal files not being deleted from the computer prior to logging off. Each public computer station has posted the following reminder for patrons to ensure they do not leave any downloaded, transferred, or copied personal files on the computer: PATRONS: BE SURE TO DELETE ANY FILES YOU HAVE DOWNLOADED PRIOR TO LOGGING OFF! IF NOT, THE NEXT PATRON CAN ACCESS YOUR DOCUMENTS!

Due to the high demand for electronic resources, the Library may establish time limits in order to accommodate members who are waiting.

Ultimate responsibility for problems related to the invasion of the user's privacy or loss of data rests with the user. The Library assumes no liability for loss or damage to the user's computer, software, data, or for any damage or injury arising from the use of the Library's internet connection.

As with most public wireless "hot spots," the Library's wireless connection is not secure. Any information being transmitted could potentially be intercepted. Cautious and informed wireless users should choose not to transmit personal information or confidential data while using any wireless connection. Users should take appropriate precautions when using this service.

The Library and its staff are not liable for any damage to personal equipment and files resulting from use of library computer stations.

### **Internet Training**

The Library may recommend interesting and useful internet destinations and resources for library users to explore. Library staff, however, cannot provide in-depth individual instruction on the internet or personal computer use, nor can they troubleshoot problems related to wireless devices, device network settings and/or hardware configurations. The Library offers classes and formal training on access to the internet at designated times and places and provides general information and handouts for connecting devices to the Library's wireless connection.

### Revisions

This is a working document. Changes in state or federal law, usage, or available technology may require frequent revisions.



### Hendry County Library Cooperative Policies

### **Animals in Library Buildings**

### **Statement of Policy:**

Patrons are not permitted to bring animals into any library building with the exception of the following:

Service Animals: In accordance with the <u>Americans With Disabilities Act</u>, any person with a disability is allowed to bring their service animal into the library. Staff may ask the person who has the animal if it is a service animal required because of a disability and may ask what tasks the animal has been trained to perform in order to determine the difference between a service animal and a pet. Any animal identified as a service animal must be admitted.

The care and supervision of the service animal is solely the responsibility of the owner. If the service animal is aggressive with staff or other patrons or if it otherwise acts out of control, the person may be asked to take the animal from the building. The person with the disability will be given the option of using the library without having the service animal on the premises. For more information see Florida Statute Chapter 413.08

Emotional support animals, comfort animals, and therapy animals are not "service animals" within the definitions provided in the Americans With Disability Act and therefore are prohibited on Library property except as may be authorized for a Library program, in designated areas.

Library-sponsored Programs: The library may choose to offer educational programs for the public that include various animals. Such animals are permitted in the library building for the duration of the program and must be accompanied by the owner at all times.

All animals on Library property, must have vaccinations and display license tags. All animal waste shall be disposed of by the person responsible for the animal.

### **Violation of Policy:**

Patrons who violate this policy will be made aware of the violation. Patrons will be asked to remove the animal from the building/property immediately. Failure to remove the animal from the building/property as instructed may result in prohibition from returning to the library for a specific amount of time as determined by the Branch Library Director or their designee. Failure to leave the building when asked to do so will be considered trespassing, and may result in law enforcement being contacted.

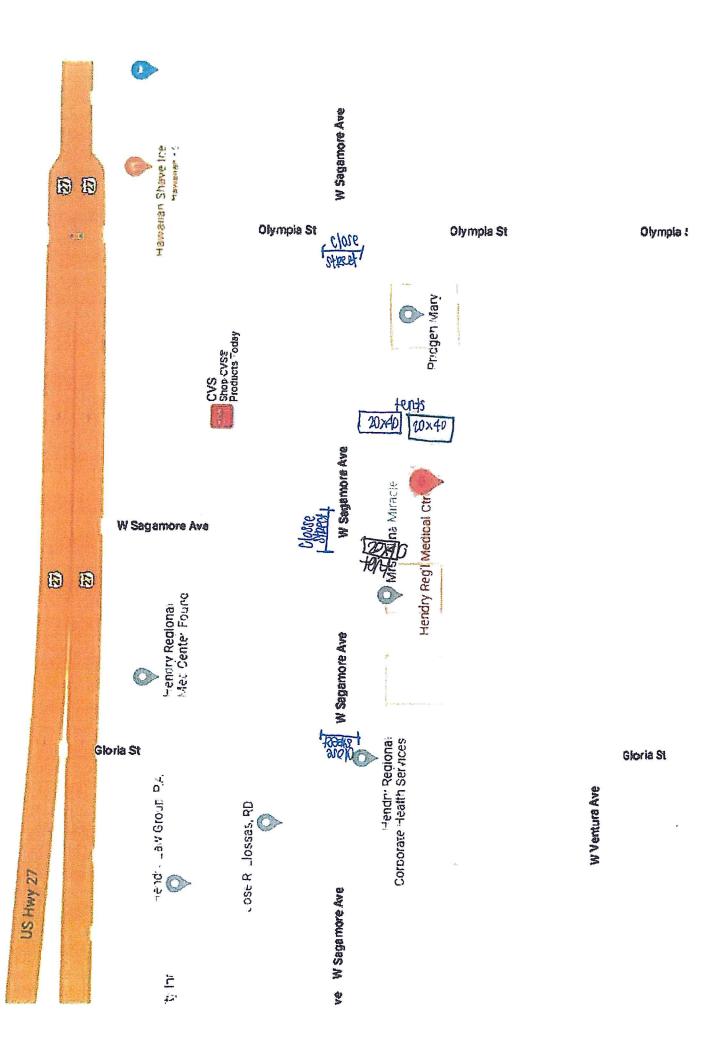

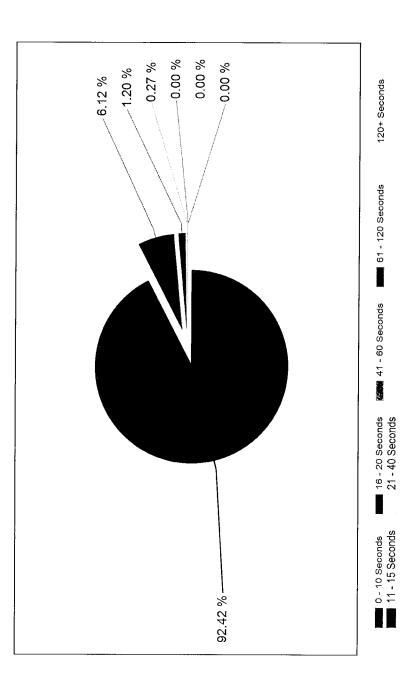
