CITY COMMISSION WORKSHOP Monday, November 27, 2023

The City of Clewiston City Commission held a workshop in the City Hall Commission Chambers, Monday, November 27, 2023. The workshop was called to order at 3:00 p.m. by Mayor James Pittman. Mayor Pittman gave the invocation and the audience joined in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

Commissioners present: Mayor James Pittman, Vice Mayor Greg Thompson, Commissioner Barbara Edmonds, Commissioner Mali Gardner and Commissioner Hillary Hyslope

Personnel present: City Manager Randy Martin, IT Administrator JD Lucas, Police Chief Tom Lewis, Community Development Director Travis Reese, Consulting Engineer Andy Tilton and City Attorney Dylan Brandenburg (via phone)

Visitors present: Jeff Nagle

Additions/Deletions/Changes and Approval of the Agenda – Manager Martin stated that there were no additions, deletions or changes to the Agenda.

Public comments – There were no public comments.

- 1. Ventura Streetscape/resurfacing project design Consulting Engineer Tilton stated that the City has approximately \$1.8 million in federal and state grant funds to do improvements to Ventura from Deane Duff to W.C. Owen Avenue. Tetra Tech will be the engineer for the resurfacing part of the project. Without the landscaping design, it would just be a mill and resurface project. Engineer Tilton introduced Jeff Nagle, head of Johnson Engineering's landscape architect group. Mr. Nagle reviewed the presentation on the project design. He stated they can't start SCOP until a concept is approved by FDOT. He commented on the presentation ideas on parking along the two sections on either side of Central Avenue. This is an approximate ¼ mile long area and includes a possible roundabout. The consensus of the Commission was to try and have something ready for a workshop before the regular meeting on December 18.
- 2. CRA Update City Manager Martin stated that he has reviewed prior documents regarding the CRA and says there have always been visionary plans and ideas through the years. Mayor Pittman and Commissioner Gardner are the only two members of the commission that were involved back when the CRA was formed. Funds were gone by 2011 after a number of businesses were able to apply for facade grants and use funding to

improve their property along US27. Manager Martin praised the city for starting the CRA when they did. Most of the visionary plans are not outdated and are still relevant today. He would like to work more with staff looking at pieces of the plans such as streetscape, improved lighting, public art program, landscaping, pedestrian safety, utility upgrades, underground improvements and parking enhancements. In 2016, there was a Main Street Revitalization Plan; 2021 saw a FDOT vision for US27; and 2022 was the Waterfront Master Plan. Commissioner Gardner stated that she would like to see the Fairgrounds be redeveloped with maybe a rodeo arena and an area for concerts. She also feels development is necessary along the main corridor of W.C. Owen Avenue. Vice Mayor Thompson stated that he would like to see if the City can use CRA funds for infrastructure. Commissioner Gardner asked to have the list of CRA advisory members for the January 22nd workshop.

- 3. U.S. 27 Corridor Ordinance Review Commissioner Gardner stated they have had several workshops regarding the US27 Ordinance but the map they are viewing in this agenda is from 2022 and doesn't include the changes made in Ordinance 2023-03. Deane Duff to W.C. Owen is blocked out where property owners could do anything they wanted. City Manager Martin will get with City Clerk Combass to research the workshop minutes from the several meetings and clarify the uses for the whole corridor.
- 4. Park hours and camping ordinance discussion City Attorney Brandenburg joined the meeting via telephone to discuss the draft ordinance he prepared. Police Chief Lewis spoke about the trespassing on City owned land. He stated there should be a rule stating that no one is allowed on City property from dusk to dawn so that the police can properly deal with situations as they arise.

CITY COMMISSION WORKSHOP Monday, December 18, 2023

The City of Clewiston City Commission held a workshop in the City Hall Commission Chambers, Monday, December 18, 2023. The workshop was called to order at 3:00 p.m. by Mayor James Pittman.

Commissioners present: Mayor James Pittman, Vice Mayor Greg Thompson, Commissioner Barbara Edmonds, Commissioner Mali Gardner and Commissioner Hillary Hyslope

Personnel present: City Manager Randy Martin, Police Chief Tom Lewis, Fire Chief Travis Reese, Recreation Director Lauren McGinnis, IT Administrator Justin Lucas, and City Attorney Dylan Brandenburg

Visitors present: Jerry Cochrane, Steve Daniel and Starla Dixon

Additions/Deletions/Changes and Approval of the Agenda – Manager Martin stated that there were no additions, deletions or changes to the Agenda.

Public Comments – Mr. Jerry Cochrane commented about his concerns regarding the trailers in violation of the city's ordinance. He would like to see it enforced better. Commissioner Gardner stated she feels the ordinance should be enforced or redrafted and brought back to the commission at the January 2024 workshop.

Mr. Steve Daniel commented about his concerns regarding a neighbor dispute over graphic signs on his property. He stated that he had his property surveyed in order to erect a fence but the neighbor has disputed this and refuses to remove his signs. Code Enforcement is in the process of citing him. Chief Lewis said that the police can only respond to a criminal issue, not a civil issue. Mr. Daniel expressed that he would like to resolve this dispute without going to court.

1. Ventura Streetscape/Resurfacing Project Design – Manager Martin stated this is a continuing discussion from the November 27, 2023 workshop. He held a meeting with administration, staff and engineers. The consensus is that there are two favorable options reflected from the comments. A roundabout is included in both options according to Johnson Engineer Dave Troutdeau. Concerns over the Baptist Church handicap spots was voiced by Commissioner Gardner. She also said that a lesson was learned on Bond Street from years ago, making the islands small to allow more parking and traffic flow. Also, there are concerns about semi-trucks using that area to access Royals Furniture and Ace Hardware. Commissioner Gardner feels the whole roundabout project is a nightmare. Commissioner Hyslope feels Option B looks cleaner. Manager Martin feels central parking

seems a better option now that he's had time to review and reflect on the design. Fire Chief Reese stated that there shouldn't be an issue for fire apparatus.

- 2. U.S. 27 Corridor Expansion & Downtown Commercial District Expansion Manager Martin collaborated with Community Development Director Travis Reese in reviewing prior minutes of workshops regarding the comp plan and future land use map changes for the expansion of the US27 Corridor and Downtown commercial district. The City approved the rezoning of all of the properties included in the land use modification of the land use map. Actions left on the table was the east end of town which are currently zoned industrial on the north and south sides of the corridor. Administration recommendation is to modify the corridor ordinance to include those two properties and follow it with a required amendment to the comp plan and future land use map followed by a zoning action to include it in the US27 corridor. According to Director Reese, now would a good time to modify the comp plan and FLUM as the process is relatively easy to accomplish and work on a new ordinance for the downtown district. Commissioner Gardner stated that the process was started quite a long time ago and it's still not completed. She feels that the Clewiston Inn should be included in the US27 Corridor.
- 3. CRA Update Manager Martin stated this is only on the agenda for the involvement with the Ventura Avenue project with focus on Bond Street for CRA funding. Staff will provide a list of the CRA advisory members and check to make sure they are still willing to serve. If not, the City will advertise for vacancies, if any. This will be placed on the January workshop agenda for review and discussion.
- 4. Hendry County Impact Fee Presentation and Master Fee Schedule Manager Martin briefly outlined the meeting with Hendry County officials. He reported that, at their meeting on Dec. 12th, they discussed the possibility of resuming impact fees, which were a part of permits several years ago to benefit schools and transportation primarily. This time the County would like to include funds for law enforcement as well. He stated that if the commission was agreeable, it could be arranged to have the company present the information at 3:00 p.m. on the day of the next regular meeting which is to be held on Monday, January 22, 2024. They also considered adding EMS and Fire to this document and are going to look into putting the three libraries in the county into consideration as well. He stated the hospital was not included in this analysis.
- 5. Commission Comments and Discussion Commissioner Hyslope commented on her concern about an email regarding recreation that was received by the commission today. She expressed that she feels the City's strategy is to block services if something gets hard or beyond the scope of what we might want to offer and that cannot be the way we handle everything because the taxpayers pay for these services. She added that she would really like to see more sports programs implemented because our facilities are not being utilized. Commissioner Gardner stated that she was going to bring it up at the regular meeting but feels the biggest concern is that there seems to be a lot of miscommunication. She agreed with Commissioner Hyslope's comments about programs. Mayor Pittman stated that he had not yet seen the email but was planning to make a comment at the regular meeting about only one gate being open at a soccer game he attended. He feels that all gates should

be open so that people can park on all sides of the facility. Commissioner Gardner stated that there seems to be some issues that need to be addressed and it is Manager Martin's responsibility to take care of them, but when they have continuous citizen concerns coming to them, they have no choice to address it for the benefit of the community. Manager Martin stated that he will respond to the email as his responsibility and will schedule a discussion on this item for a January 2024 workshop.

Public Comments – Starla Dixon addressed the commission about an issue concerning a Utility Department employee who also works at Dollar General. Mayor Pittman stated that Director Williams will address this matter.

Adjournment

2. Ordinance No. 2024-06 - First Reading - Ordinance No. 2024-06 amends the Clewiston Code of Ordinances, Chapter 74, Utilities, Article I. - In General; Creating Section 74-14. - Meter Tampering.

Mayor Pittman read Ordinance No. 2024-06 by title and asked for public comments. There were no public comments.

Commissioner Gardner made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Edmonds, to approve Ordinance No. 2024-06 on first reading and set the public hearing for July 15, 2024. Vote 5 yeas, 0 nays

3. Ordinance No. 2024-07 - First Reading - Ordinance No. 2024-07 amends the Clewiston Code of Ordinances, Chapter 2, Administration, Article III - Purchasing Procedures; Section 2-78. - Purchasing Thresholds.

Mayor Pittman read Ordinance No. 2024-07 by title and asked for public comments. There were no public comments.

Commissioner Hyslope made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Edmonds, to approve Ordinance No. 2024-07 on first reading and set the public hearing for July 15, 2024. Vote 5 yeas, 0 nays

RESOLUTIONS

4. Resolution No. 2024-037 – Resolution No. 2024-037 authorizes the modification of the Tyler Technologies Enterprise Software Agreement to a cloud based solution for a \$32,946 annual increase.

Mayor Pittman read Resolution No. 2024-037 by title and suggested the resolution be revised to include language that the amount not exceed \$32,946 annually. Director Maxson then commented on the request. Commissioner Gardner expressed that she felt this modification made sense and we should not wait any longer.

Commissioner Gardner made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Hyslope, to approve Resolution No. 2024-037 with the revision that the modification be approved for an amount up to \$32,946 annually. Vote 5 yeas, 0 nays

5. Resolution No. 2024-038 – Resolution No. 2024-038 authorizes the Mayor to sign the State of Florida Department of Transportation Small County Outreach Program (SCOP) Agreement to provide funding for the design, construction, and CEI of the milling and resurfacing of North Francisco Street from US27/US80 to Herbert Hoover Dike Road.

Mayor Pittman read Resolution No. 2024-038 by title.

Vice Mayor Thompson made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Edmonds, to approve Resolution No. 2024-038. Vote 5 yeas, 0 nays

Before the vote, Engineer Steven Howard commented on the timeline of the project. He felt that by December 31 once the project was designed, we would have a better idea of the construction timeline. He then commented on the project including the two culvert crossings. Mayor Pittman asked Manager Williams to keep the commission updated on when the design is done and possibly provide a presentation for them on that.

6. Resolution No. 2024-039 – Resolution No. 2024-039 approves the Personnel Policy Manual.

Mayor Pittman read Resolution No. 2024-039 by title. Vice Mayor Thompson suggested that the new HR Manager be given an opportunity to review this personnel policy manual as he felt there were no substantial changes. Commissioner Gardner stated that she believed some of it needed to be updated from a legal standpoint but felt that updating it now is the right thing to do and then completely re-write it after the HR Director and City Attorney look at it. She added that there have been updates at different times since 2004. Attorney Brandenburg stated that there have been updates in state employment law that you have to follow regardless of whether it is in your policy or not.

Commissioner Gardner made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Hyslope, to approve Resolution No. 2024-039. Vote 5 yeas, 0 nays

Commissioner Gardner made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Hyslope, to have a new Personnel Policy Manual back to the Commission for review within the next 90 days. Vote 5 yeas, 0 nays

7. **DELETED - Resolution No. 2024-040** – Resolution No. 2024-040 approves the agreement between the City of Clewiston and U.S. Sugar Corporation for the Golf Course Irrigation Project.

MISCELLANEOUS ACTION AND DISCUSSION ITEMS

- 8. 2024 Legislative Session Summary City Attorney Dylan Brandenburg stated that he considered postponing this summary for another month because several bills have not yet been considered. He agreed to keep the commission updated. He then reviewed and commented on some of the listed items. Vice Mayor Thompson mentioned that semis are being parked at the lake and because it is public parking, there is nothing that we can do. Attorney Brandenburg stated the commission could direct staff to come back with a proposal for that. Commissioner Gardner stated that she feels it should be looked at because she has also seen semis parking in residential neighborhoods; our boat basin area is for boating and recreation.
- 9. Old Business Manager Williams stated that CPAC is interested in renting the building across the street; we are looking at demolishing the current CPAC building that was donated to the City by the American Legion. He reported that a contractor is interested in building apartments there and U.S. Sugar is also interested as they also have property in that location. Commissioner Gardner stated that she would like to make sure there are no restrictions with

the American Legion. Vice Mayor Thompson asked for an update on the WC Owen property development. Manager Williams reported that project was postponed. Commissioner Edmonds asked if anything had been decided on the parking area behind the old police department building. Manager Williams stated that funding to resurface that parking lot will probably be included in the upcoming budget. Vice Mayor Thompson asked if Manager Williams had thought any more about the ribbon cutting ceremony for the bridge project because we will need to coordinate the date with our representatives. Manager Williams stated that he feels it would be nice to dedicate the bridge to Senator Passidomo because she had a lot of input on helping us get those funds. Commissioner Edmonds asked how we are going to house the new fire truck. Director Reese commented on the look of the new firetruck and stated that the size would be similar to what we have now so it would fit in one of the bays we have.

- 11. Comments from Interim City Manager Manager Williams introduced Recreation Program Director, Tim Pruitt. Director Pruitt addressed the commission and commented on how the ballfields and soccer fields are important to him. He asked the commission to be patient as he and Recreation Director Sergent work with the middle and high schools to bring some programs back to the Youth Center.
- 12. Comments from City Attorney Commissioner Gardner stated that she is hoping Attorney Brandenburg can give guidance on Airbnb's and house rentals. Attorney Brandenburg said he could bring forward a recommendation by the next meeting.
- 13. Comments from the City Commission Commissioner Edmonds stated that she has received complaints about the increase of utility bills. Manager Williams explained how the City's utilities portal works. Commissioner Gardner noted the cost of electric has not increased. Assistant Utilities Director Lynne Mila stated that the City's website explains how to get on the portal and set up an account. Utility System Administrator Debbie Clay encouraged anyone to call her at 863-983-1454 if they have questions about their utility bill. She added that although it is not yet available online, budgeting for customers has always been available and can be set up by staff. Commissioner Edmonds then asked if the city has a senior citizens program and noted that the senior citizens building looks really bad. Program Director Pruitt stated that they are currently looking at programs for senior citizens.

Vice Mayor Thompson stated that he is looking forward to the summer season. He couldn't be happier with the individuals hired to fill the vacant positions and felt the city was better off for it.

Commissioner Hyslope echoed Vice Mayor Thompson's comments and mentioned that she is looking forward to what the new recreation staff can do for summer camp next year that would be more feasible. She also mentioned that she feels the updates on the city's finances that Manager Williams and Director Maxson have been doing are incredible and the response from staff is refreshing.

Commissioner Gardner stated that after hearing her fellow commissioners' comments tonight on how things are going and working out, she would like to remove interim from Manager Williams' title because she feels he has proven himself as our city manager. Attorney Brandenburg stated that his recommendation would be to formalize it as an agenda item.

Commissioner Gardner made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Hyslope, for the City Attorney to bring an agreement and resolution to the commission at the next commission meeting to remove "interim" from his title and make Danny Williams the City Manager. Vote 5 yeas, 0 nays

Mayor Pittman asked if we were due for comp plan review. Director Reese stated that our comprehensive plan is in need of an update. He explained that the rules that required us to do it every seven years were removed, but we do have to notify the state of any changes. He stated that we are outside our planning stages; 2025 is our long range planning. He suggested we do short range and long range planning because he feels we need more than just an update. Mayor Pittman next commented on the passing of Commissioner Gardner's husband, Terry Gardner. He stated that Mr. Gardner served the community through the Rotary Club and other things and was always jovial and a fun guy. As Mayor and on behalf of the City and City Commission, he offered condolences to Commissioner Gardner.

Adjournment

Mayor Pittman declared the meeting adjourned with unanimous consensus of the members present at 6:12 p.m.

CITY OF CLEWISTON Regular Commission Meeting July 15, 2024

The Clewiston City Commission held its regular meeting in the City Hall Commission Chambers on Monday, July 15, 2024. The meeting was called to order at 5:00 p.m. by Mayor James Pittman. Mayor Pittman gave the invocation and the audience joined in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

<u>Commissioners Present</u>: Mayor James Pittman, Vice Mayor Greg Thompson, Commissioner Barbara Edmonds and Commissioner Mali Gardner. Commissioner Hillary Hyslope was absent. Vice Mayor Greg Thompson attended the beginning of the meeting via telephone and joined the meeting in person at 5:30 p.m.

<u>Personnel Present</u>: Interim City Manager Danny Williams, Finance Director Randy Maxson, Assistant Utilities Director Lynne Mila, IT Administrator Justin Lucas, Police Chief Tom Lewis, Community Development Director/Fire Chief Travis Reese, Recreation/HR Director Ashly Sergent, Program Director Tim Pruitt, Consulting Engineer David Trouteaud and City Attorney Dylan Brandenburg.

<u>Visitors Present</u>: John Vanni, Neale Montgomery, Michael Rosen, Cary Wall, Lisa Walker, Roly Gonzalez, Roly Gonzalez, Jr., Janet Taylor, Tammy Bunting and Chuck Svirk.

Additions/Deletions/Changes and Approval of the Agenda – There were no additions, deletions or changes to the agenda.

Public Comments – Mr. Roly Gonzalez, of 305 Via del Aqua, apologized to Manager Williams and Police Chief Lewis for interrupting their time last night because of a resident complaining about his campaign signs. He mentioned that Commissioners Gardner and Hyslope were on the radio March 18, 2024 and Commissioner Hyslope stated that morale of the city was really low. He stated that he feels the residents make it low. He then stated that he feels he is being harassed by the city for having his 4x8 political signs on his vehicle. He explained that he received permission to put the signs up and then received a call with an undated apology letter and copy of the city's policy regarding political signs that was approved in 2016. He wants to get this cleared up today. Mayor Pittman suggested that he meet with Manager Williams and City Attorney Brandenburg after tonight's meeting to look at the city's ordinance. Mr. Gonzalez thanked the commission for their time. Commissioner Gardner clarified that on March 18, she was not on the radio; she was here at the City Commission Meeting and any comments that she makes are public comments and if the radio station deems to use any comment that she makes, it is for the public record.

1. Consent Agenda

A. Resolution No. 2024-041 – Designation of Voting Delegate for the Florida League of Cities' Annual Conference

- B. Resolution No. 2024-042 Renewal Agreement for Disaster Debris Monitoring Services with Thompson Consulting Services.
- C. Resolution No. 2024-043 Renewal Agreement for Disaster Debris Monitoring Services with Tetra Tech, Inc.

Commissioner Gardner made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Edmonds, to approve the Consent Agenda. Vote 4 yeas, 0 nays (Commissioner Hyslope was absent.)

Manager Williams stated the representatives of the Glades/Lakes Area Teen Summit are running late. He asked Consulting Engineer David Trouteaud to comment on the Ventura project and other city projects. Engineer Trouteaud reported that Tetra Tech's survey is done for the Ventura project and they are planning to get their 60% plans around the end of August and at that time, they will come back to the Commission. He next reported on the C-21 Bridge project. He stated the contractor is working through the parking lot modifications and towards seal coating, which should be happening soon. He next reported on the Francisco project. He reminded the Commission that this is a SCOP agreement and the signed agreement that was approved by the City was sent to DOT and we're waiting on the fully executed document from them. He stated that we anticipate an agreement with Stantec for the next meeting that will be underneath the SCOP agreement. He then reported the Phase 5 Landscaping project was out to bid. The bid had to be re-advertised because we didn't get any bidders the first time. The bid opening is scheduled for July 25 and because we sent the bid package out to 25-30 bidders, we're getting a little bit more positive response this time. He stated that Phase 6 of the design would be next and we're talking to utility providers to make sure we're clear of them.

The public hearing for Ordinance No. 2024-03 (Agenda Item No. 3) was held next.

2. PRESENTATION – Glades/Lakes Area Teen Summit – This agenda item was presented after Agenda Item No. 3.

Ms. Tammy Bunting stated that a Glades Teen Summit is being organized by the commissioners, mayors, citizens and faith based organizations out of the Glades for August 2 through August 4. They are looking to do something to bring the teens from the Belle Glade, South Bay and Clewiston communities together and want to get the support of the community. She reviewed the presentation and commented on the summit goals and activities. Ms. Janet Taylor came forward and asked the commission to encourage teens from the Clewiston community to register for the summit.

The public hearing for Ordinance No. 2024-06 (Agenda Item No. 4) was held next.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

3. Ordinance No. 2024-03 – PUBLIC HEARING - Final Reading – 5:05 p.m. - Ordinance No. 2024-03 amends the Clewiston Code of Ordinances, § 50-7, Storage on Private Property.

Mayor Pittman read Ordinance No. 2024-03 by title, opened the public hearing and asked for public comments. There were no public comments. Commissioner Gardner stated that she had not received any comments from the public on this and asked if there were any additional comments received from anyone. Director Reese stated that the P & Z Board looked at this ordinance extensively. They recommended removing the 60 foot requirement for having a travel trailer on your property and asked the Commission what they feel should be the correct number allowed in the front yard or front yard at all. They ordinance presented tonight removes the 60-foot required setback. He also stated that it is the commission's discretion if they would like to put a number of trailers you can have in your front yard or leave it. The City's current ordinance requires them to be stored in the back yard. Attorney Brandenburg stated that you could table the final reading of this ordinance to another designated date and time or you could vote it down. After further discussion, Commissioner Gardner and Mayor Pittman expressed they feel a joint workshop with the P&Z Board is needed for further review and discussion. Mayor Pittman closed the public hearing.

Commissioner Edmonds made a motion, seconded by Vice Mayor Thompson, to table the final reading of Ordinance No. 2024-03 to the October 21, 2024 Commission Meeting. Vote 4 yeas, 0 nays (Commissioner Hyslope was absent.)

After the vote, Commissioner Gardner mentioned that a workshop would be scheduled before the October 21, 2024 Commission Meeting.

Agenda Item No. 2 was presented next.

4. Ordinance No. 2024-06 – PUBLIC HEARING - Final Reading – 5:05 p.m. - Ordinance No. 2024-06 amends the Clewiston Code of Ordinances, Chapter 74, Utilities, Article I. – In General; Creating Section 74-14. – Meter Tampering.

Mayor Pittman read Ordinance No. 2024-06 by title, opened the public hearing and asked for public comments. There were no public comments. Mayor Pittman closed the public hearing.

Vice Mayor Thompson made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Gardner, to approve Ordinance No. 2024-06. Vote 4 yeas, 0 nays (Commissioner Hyslope was absent.)

5. Ordinance No. 2024-07 – PUBLIC HEARING - Final Reading – 5:05 p.m. - Ordinance No. 2024-07 amends the Clewiston Code of Ordinances, Chapter 2, Administration, Article III – Purchasing Procedures; Section 2-78. – Purchasing Thresholds.

Mayor Pittman read Ordinance No. 2024-07 by title, opened the public hearing and asked for public comments. There were no public comments. Commissioner Edmonds stated that she is in favor of this ordinance but feels the Commission should be made aware of any large purchases. Manager Williams assured the Commission that they would be informed of any large purchases. He explained that this ordinance does not apply to capital items; it would only apply to day-to-day and emergency repairs. Commissioner Gardner stated that the

ordinance states that commission approval would be required for the award of all contracts, material, equipment, work or services in excess of \$25,000 for non-budgeted items. Mayor Pittman closed the public hearing.

Commissioner Gardner made a motion, seconded by Vice Mayor Thompson, to approve Ordinance No. 2024-07. Vote 4 yeas, 0 nays (Commissioner Hyslope was absent.)

ORDINANCES

6. Ordinance No. 2024-08 – First Reading - Ordinance No. 2024-08 provides for the annexation of additional territory owned by Hendry County School Board to be included within the city boundaries in accordance with Articles VII Section 2(c) of the Constitution of the State of Florida and Section 171.044, Florida Statutes, as amended.

Mayor Pittman read Ordinance No. 2024-08 by title. Attorney Brandenburg swore in all applicants and anyone planning to give testimony related to the applications for agenda item numbers 6-11. He then asked that if any of the commissioners has had any ex parte communications or had conducted any site visits in conjunction with the annexation to disclose that at this time. No disclosures by any of the commissioners were made. Director Reese reported that there is no financial impact to the city at this time other than the cost of the applications and advertising which costs are borne solely by the applicants. He confirmed that the city will provide water and sewer to the annexed property and he believed two of the three applicants are ready to develop the property and stated that it would be an incentive for the city to have the property annexed especially if it will be providing electric, water and sewer services. Director Reese and Manager Williams confirmed the city has the capacity to support the annexation. Vice Mayor Thompson stated that he wanted to make sure that if this property is developed soon, the city has the capability of supporting it and the costs would be put on the developer and not the city. Director Reese stated that we have impact fees specifically for that reason so that the citizens do not pay for an expansion that they do not need. He then commented on the annexation of the U.S. Sugar property. He stated that U.S. Sugar has a master plan, comprehensive plan addition to add an employment hub, and rezone request for tonight to move quickly. Commissioner Gardner noted that the original master plan of Clewiston was done in the 20's and this will be the first expansion of the city limits in our boundaries. She feels it is a very exciting time for the city and is wonderful that we are expanding our city limits and incorporating more land into our tax base. Director Reese confirmed that water, sewer and electric for the residential and commercial areas have been calculated into all of the projects on the north and south side of the highway. He stated that Mike Rosen has worked with each one of the applicants and pointed out that the Hendry County School Board and Kelly Tractor will keep the underlying zoning and comprehensive land use designations of Hendry County until we decide to change those when the applicant comes to us. Mr. Rosen came forward and stated that he's been in contact with Hendry County School Board Chair Mike Swindle and the Kelly Tractor brothers and they are all well aware of what's happening with the annexations and they realize that there are tax ramifications they will be paying in the future to be part of the city. They also understand that as development happens, they will be using city utilities and paying those fees in addition to impact fees. After hearing no further comments, Mayor Pittman declared the public hearing for Ordinance No. 2024-08 closed.

Commissioner Gardner made a motion, seconded by Vice Mayor Thompson, to approve Ordinance No. 2024-08 on first reading and set the public hearing for August 19, 2024. Vote 4 yeas, 0 nays (Commissioner Hyslope was absent.)

7. Ordinance No. 2024-09 – First Reading - Ordinance No. 2024-09 provides for the annexation of additional territory owned by Kelly Tractor Co. to be included within the city boundaries in accordance with Articles VII Section 2(c) of the Constitution of the State of Florida and Section 171.044, Florida Statutes, as amended.

Mayor Pittman read Ordinance No. 2024-09 by title and declared the public hearing open. Attorney Brandenburg again asked for disclosures from the commissioners if any have had any ex parte communications or have conducted any site visits in conjunction with the annexation. No disclosures by any of the commissioners were made. After hearing no comments by the public or the commission, Mayor Pittman declared the public hearing closed.

Vice Mayor Thompson made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Gardner, to approve Ordinance No. 2024-09 on first reading and set the public hearing for August 19, 2024. Vote 4 yeas, 0 nays (Commissioner Hyslope was absent.)

8. Ordinance No. 2024-10 – First Reading - Ordinance No. 2024-10 provides for the annexation of additional territory owned by United States Sugar Corporation to be included within the city boundaries in accordance with Articles VII Section 2(c) of the Constitution of the State of Florida and Section 171.044, Florida Statutes, as amended.

Mayor Pittman read Ordinance No. 2024-10 by title and declared the public hearing open. Attorney Brandenburg again asked for disclosures from the commissioners if any have had any ex parte communications or have conducted any site visits in conjunction with the annexation. Commissioner Gardner stated that she believes she spoke to Mr. Rosen years ago about the north and south developments but doesn't remember if he had mentioned anything about the annexation. After hearing no further comments, Mayor Pittman declared the public hearing closed.

Commissioner Gardner made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Edmonds, to approve Ordinance No. 2024-10 on first reading and set the public hearing for August 19, 2024. Vote 4 yeas, 0 nays (Commissioner Hyslope was absent.)

9. Ordinance No. 2024-11 – First Reading - Ordinance No. 2024-11 adopts an amendment to the City's Comprehensive Development Plan in accordance with the mandates set forth in Section 163.3184, Florida Statutes, pursuant to a privately initiated application, which provides for an amendment to the City Future Land Use Map creating the Employment Hub

District and re-designating five (5) parcels of real property comprising approximately $477 \pm$ acres, more or less in size, currently designated Hendry County "Multi-Use", as "Employment Hub District", such parcels of land are located North of US27 and directly West of the prior existing city boundary.

Mayor Pittman read Ordinance No. 2024-11 by title, declared the public hearing open and asked for comments from the public and commission. Commissioner Gardner asked for clarification regarding the conflicting maps in the agenda packet for agenda items 9 and 10. Director Reese stated the correct map will be attached as Exhibit B for the final reading. Ms. Neale Montgomery came forward to comment on the significance of an Employment Hub District and explained that as they heard before, the two parcels are going to stay with county zoning and future land use and that is because the Florida Statute says when you annex in to a city, you come in with county or unincorporated areas zoning and land use. Employment hub is a city category that mirrors the same kinds of uses as the current mixed use commercial future land use category so there is a tax amendment to adopt the category and a map amendment to put it on this property. Mayor Pittman asked if we will have to adopt an ordinance for the new district. Director Reese confirmed that another ordinance would eventually be needed to lay out what can and can't be done within that district and we will work with the property owner on that before the property is sold. He added that it is not unusual to create the district first with the comprehensive plan. Ms. Montgomery and Mr. Rosen commented further on how the employment hub category allows the mix of industrial and commercial retail or office so that needs can be met in one area without having to drive outside the corridor. Mr. Rosen stated there is no residential involved, it is strictly commercial retail and industrial and was designed to support future businesses that will be coming into this area. He also pointed out that the development will not all be done at one time; it will be done in phases.

After further discussion, Attorney Brandenburg called for disclosures from the Commission of any ex parte communications or site visits in conjunction with this comp plan amendment. There were no disclosures from the commission. Mr. John Vanni came forward and clarified that the uses are not changing from what they are now; it is a name change when you pull it into the city. After hearing no further comments, Mayor Pittman declared the public hearing closed.

Commissioner Gardner made a motion, seconded by Vice Mayor Thompson, to approve Ordinance No. 2024-11 on first reading and set the public hearing for August 19, 2024. Vote 4 yeas, 0 nays (Commissioner Hyslope was absent.)

10. Ordinance No. 2024-12 – First Reading - Ordinance No. 2024-12 provides for the rezoning of certain real property within the corporate limits of the City of Clewiston, which property consists of five parcels of land lying in Sections 7 and 8, Township 43 South, Range 34 East, Hendry County, Florida; provides that these parcels of real property shall be assigned the city zoning designation of PUD "Planned Unit Development District – Clewiston 440"; provides that the zoning map of the City of Clewiston be amended to reflect the proper designation these parcels; provides that a master concept plan for the project is hereby approved in accordance with Section 110-457 of the City of Clewiston Zoning Code.

Mayor Pittman read Ordinance No. 2024-12 by title and declared the public hearing open. Attorney Brandenburg called for the disclosure of any ex parte communications or site visits in conjunction with this rezoning from the commission at this time. There were no disclosures from the commission. After hearing no comments, Mayor Pittman declared the public hearing closed.

Commissioner Gardner made a motion, seconded by Vice Mayor Thompson, to approve Ordinance No. 2024-12 on first reading and set the public hearing for August 19, 2024. Vote 4 yeas, 0 nays (Commissioner Hyslope was absent.)

11. Ordinance No. 2024-13 – First Reading - Ordinance No. 2024-13 abandons and vacates the City's interest in a portion of the Okeechobee Avenue Right of Way, located North of Block 24 of the General Plan of Clewiston, as revised, subject to utility & access easement(s) to be maintained along the entire length of the existing easement.

Mayor Pittman read Ordinance No. 2024-13 by title and declared the public hearing open. Attorney Brandenburg called for the disclosure of any ex parte communications or any site visits in conjunction with this application from the commission at this time. There were no disclosures from the commission. Commissioner Gardner stated that after looking at the original John Nolen plan of the city, it looked like this area was for something else. She believes it was supposed to be a hotel and boat basin. Approval of this ordinance will bring this property into alignment with the other property to the east and west of it. Manager Williams noted that the utilities would not be affected. Director Reese stated that staff sees no need to retain the property other than for utility easements. After hearing no further comments, Mayor Pittman declared the public hearing closed.

Commissioner Gardner made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Edmonds, to approve Ordinance No. 2024-13 on first reading and set the public hearing for August 19, 2024. Vote 4 yeas, 0 nays (Commissioner Hyslope was absent.)

RESOLUTIONS

12. Resolution No. 2024-040 – Resolution No. 2024-040 approves the Agreement between the City of Clewiston and United States Sugar Corporation ("US Sugar") for joint funding of construction for the municipal golf course irrigation improvements.

Mayor Pittman read Resolution No. 2024-040 by title. On behalf of the city commission, Mayor Pittman thanked U.S. Sugar for their generous support on the golf course project.

Commissioner Gardner made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Edmonds, to approve Resolution No. 2024-040. Vote 4 yeas, 0 nays (Commissioner Hyslope was absent.)

After the vote, Vice Mayor Thompson stated for the record, that this should have been approved before the work was done. Manager Williams confirmed the work was complete.

13. Resolution No. 2024-044 – Resolution No. 2024-044 approves the Continuing Agreement for Professional Services Work Order No. 2020-028 between the City of Clewiston and Johnson Engineering, Inc. for the design, permitting, bidding, and construction administration services for the Della Tobias Water Main Improvement Project.

Mayor Pittman read Resolution No. 2024-044 by title and stated that this project was 100% grant funded.

Vice Mayor Thompson made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Gardner, to approve Resolution No. 2024-044. Vote 4 yeas, 0 nays (Commissioner Hyslope was absent.)

14. Resolution No. 2024-045 – Resolution 2024-045 adopts a schedule of revised development and construction permit fees for services provided and regularly charged as specified by the City Code; and provides for an effective date.

Mayor Pittman read Resolution No. 2024-045 by title. Director Reese confirmed that we are updating the fees from 2015. He stated the International Building Code and the Construction Journal for building construction costs takes each section of each state into consideration when the fee charts are created. He stated that 90% of the building departments use a chart like this and explained that you can't just pick a cost, you have to pick the cost from a date certain and it is recommended to make a move to what they're currently being charged by the contractor. Mayor Pittman stated for the public's knowledge, that this is not what your contractor is going to charge you, this is the cost based on the permit fee, not what you are going to actually pay. Director Reese further explained that the International Building Code collects data from all building departments nationwide and they come up with an average construction cost and they publish that in the construction journal every 6 months and that state statute through the Florida Building Code and if you choose to use this chart, this is what you must use. He noted that it could also be calculated different ways but this is a more uniform way to do it. He then mentioned that we need to get the fees for land use and zoning in line with what is actually being paid.

Commissioner Edmonds made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Gardner, to approve Resolution No. 2024-045. Vote 4 yeas, 0 nays (Commissioner Hyslope was absent.)

15. Resolution No. 2024-046 – Resolution No. 2024-046 appoints Danny Williams as City Manager and authorizes the Mayor to execute an agreement for city manager services between the City of Clewiston and Danny Williams.

Mayor Pittman read Resolution No. 2024-046 by title. Attorney Brandenburg stated that he put together the agreement, which was based off the prior manager's agreement aside from a few formatting changes, and provided it to Mr. Williams for him to review. He noted that it stated that an annual review of the manager's performance will be done by the Commission.

He asked the Commission if they wanted to make any changes to the required annual review because that was an item of discussion during the last manager's tenure. Vice Mayor Thompson stated that he feels it is normal language in city manager contracts and is needed to hold them accountable and benchmark where they are at and where they are going.

Vice Mayor Thompson made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Gardner, to approve Resolution No. 2024-046. Vote 4 yeas, 0 nays (Commissioner Hyslope was absent.)

Vice Mayor Thompson encouraged Manager Williams to reach out and start his ICMA certification as soon as possible. He feels it would be helpful for him and the city as a whole.

MISCELLANEOUS ACTION AND DISCUSSION ITEMS

16. Short Term Rentals Discussion – Dylan Brandenburg

Attorney Brandenburg stated that the Commission, at a prior meeting, requested some information regarding short term rentals. He put together a brief memo from the history of the regulation of this type of use and has provided a couple of examples of some typical short term vacation rental ordinance provisions from other jurisdictions. He stated there was a recent change with regard to the rentals that specifically authorizes local governments to create registration programs and perform inspections of these uses. He stated that this is just a presentation of information open to discussion. Commissioner Gardner stated that she has heard concerns from folks in neighborhoods that have heard things like Airbnb. She doesn't know of any issues and doesn't know if it is happening here, but feels it is something that needs to be discussed. Vice Mayor Thompson stated that we don't know how many we have but every time session is in, they take a strike at this and try to take it out of the city's hands. Manager Williams stated that he doesn't see it being a problem because they are going to abide by our laws. Commissioner Gardner stated that you have rental inspections on yearly leases to safeguard everybody involved in the rental of a residential property but we don't even know what short term rentals we have or how often they are rented. She noted that our hotels have to pay the tourism development tax and these short term rentals fall under that. She knows there is quite a few short term rentals in certain unincorporated areas of the county and feels this is something that should be discussed at a workshop. She feels the same standards of our rental program should apply. Mayor Pittman stated that he thinks the registration is a good idea. He knows there are some VRBOs in LaBelle within the city limits but doesn't know how they're regulated or if they even are. He stated it is a business and asked if those owners are required to have an occupational license. Brandenburg stated they are required to register with the Department of Business Regulation and pay an applicable state tax. As of right now, he doesn't know if any of these would meet the criteria for paying a local government. Mayor Pittman stated that he thinks it is something to be discussed at a workshop and look at LaBelle and some of the other smaller communities. Vice Mayor Thompson stated the Southwest Florida League of Cities is on top of this issue and he will try to bring back something from the meeting at the end of this month. He added that we need to know what is going on in our city. Commissioner Gardner agreed that a workshop was needed and staff needed to be aware, especially the Police

Department, if there are any issues that they have been called to on. Attorney Brandenburg stated he doesn't know the last time the BTR rate schedule was revised but it might be an opportunity to look at it as a whole because he knows there have been cases in recent history of people challenging BTR taxes of being excessive.

Mr. Chuck Svirk came forward and addressed the Commission. He stated that he has been coming to this area for 3 years and is interested in developing glamping and short term rentals in this area. He stated they have a lot of Airbnb's on Lake Michigan and everybody is getting sued now because there has not been good regulation. He is not in favor of more regulation but feels the lack of it really will hurt the ability bring more industry here. He then mentioned that a feasibility study was done for all of Florida and quite a few locations around the US and the Clewiston area came back as number one. He feels this area is something really unique with the natural amenities. He also mentioned that he was happy that Mr. Williams was chosen as the City Manager; he's received more response from the city in the last two months than he has in the previous three years.

- 19. Comments from Interim City Manager Manager Williams announced that the CPAC group will be moving to the old police station building, which is currently being remodeled. He confirmed that the back half of the building is rented by the Fire Department. Mayor Pittman asked for the public, who is paying for the renovation and will they be paying rent once it is done. Manager Williams confirmed that the CPAC group is paying for everything and the rent is being negotiated. Currently, they are not paying rent, only utilities. Mayor Pittman noted that it is a worthwhile group to have in our city for the youth. Vice Mayor Thompson suggested that we assist them in finding grants, if there is a way.
- 20. Comments from City Attorney Attorney Brandenburg reported the trial counsel for the Clewiston Commons case had informed him that a potential settlement agreement was reached which would resolve the case. It had not yet been signed but it was a low level amount for the settlement. He believed the amount was \$25,000. He stated the City's insurance carrier had the authority to accept that option without the Commission's consent; it would be a settlement from the City's insurance carrier to the plaintiffs. Commissioner Gardner expressed that she would be happy because she knows that a lot of staff's time has been expended on this issue. She stated the property is a blight on the community; it has not improved in any way. Vice Mayor Thompson agreed. Commissioner Gardner asked Attorney Brandenburg to talk to staff about this. Vice Mayor Thompson stated that the amount of settlement is a relief with the amount of litigation that has been put into this. Attorney Brandenburg agreed that it was favorable.
- 21. Comments from the City Commission Commissioner Edmonds stated that she is excited about hearing that this area was number one in the study that was done by Mr. Lewis. She is excited that anybody would be looking to come to Clewiston; we are desperate for expansion and for restaurants and businesses. She then mentioned that she would like to see the few businesses we have on US 27 clean up their property. She feels the corridor is not so friendly

and doesn't look so sweet. She added that she is excited to have Mr. Williams as our City Manager.

Vice Mayor Thompson stated he is excited about the new properties being annexed into the City and knows there was some concern in the public about changing the City Manager. He assured everyone that the City hasn't stopped for one second. He feels the best possible man was chosen for the job; he has filled some significant positions since he has been the interim, mainly in the Finance and Parks & Recreation departments. He doesn't believe the city has been better off in decades. He added that Manager Williams is currently working to fill some other positions and he looks forward to see who will be chosen. Mayor Pittman agreed.

Commissioner Gardner stated that she is also excited about the projects especially the annexations happening to expand our borders. Her hope is that jobs will be created and businesses will come into that area. She agreed with Commissioner Edmonds' comments about the look of our corridor. She stated the Commission has talked about the Main Street Corridor Plan and our redevelopment, which takes buy in from the businesses on Highway 27. She has confidence that we can do much better in our bigger plazas. She feels we may need to consider our trash can size requirements because the trash cans are overflowing and trash is being scattered everywhere. She then congratulated Manager Williams and stated that he had definitely proven himself not only as Utilities Director but as Interim City Manager. She offered her support to help him and his team get these things done that are envisioned for the community. Manager Williams stated that he has a great staff. Commissioner Gardner stated that she feels redevelopment is critical; we have an expansion outside the city limits for the first time but we have so much land within the city that, in her opinion, needs to be developed, especially the blighted areas.

Mayor Pittman echoed those comments and thanked Manager Williams for the things he has already done. He stated that he has heard many good comments from citizens about the new staff and feels things are going to get better and better.

Manager Williams stated the budget workshop scheduled after this meeting tonight will need to be cancelled because it was not advertised.

Adjournment

Mayor Pittman declared the meeting adjourned with unanimous consensus of the members present at 6:47 p.m.

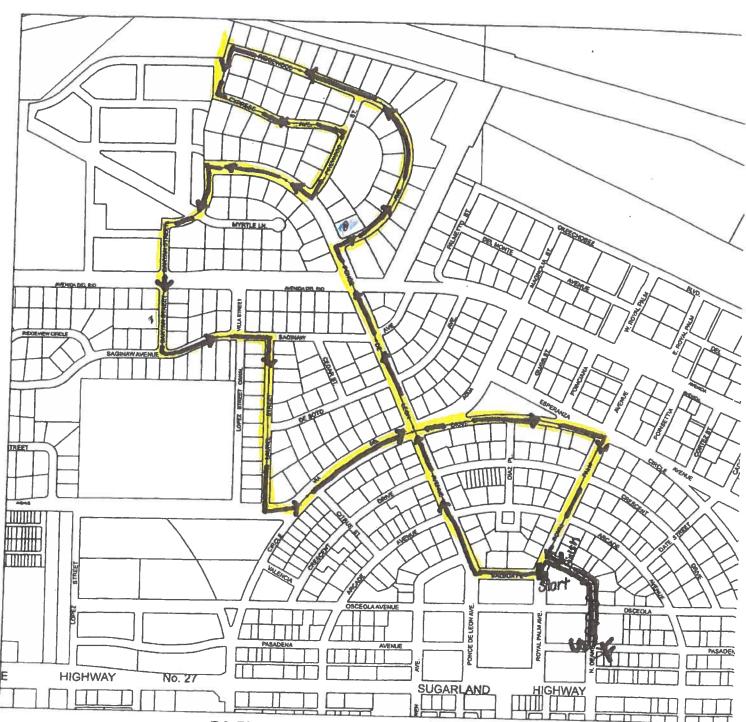

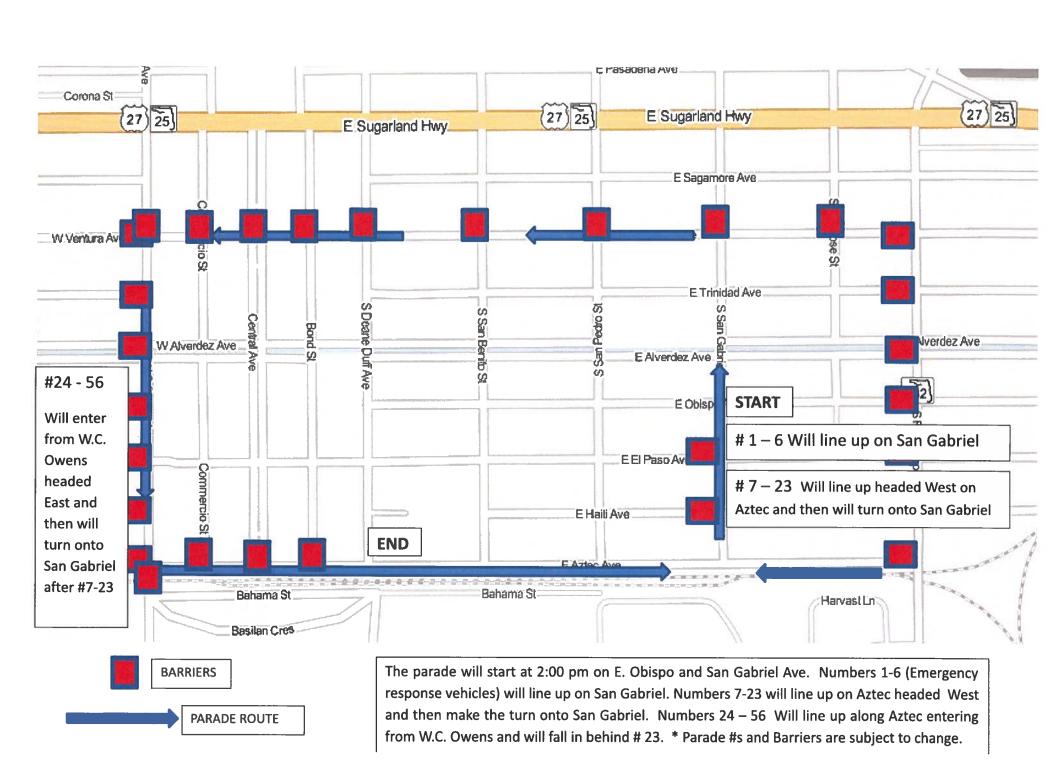

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF CLEWISTON, FLORIDA, APPROVING A MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT SERVICES ASSISTANCE BETWEEN THE HENDRY COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE AND CLEWISTON POLICE DEPARTMENT.

WHEREAS, the Hendry County Sheriff's Office and the Clewiston Police Department ("Law Enforcement Agencies") have the authority under the Florida Mutual Aid Act, Chapter 23, Part I, Florida Statutes, to enter into a combined mutual aid agreement for law enforcement services which permits voluntary cooperation and assistance of a routine law enforcement nature across jurisdictional lines, interagency training and provides for rendering of assistance in a civil disturbance or other emergency as defined in Section 252.34, F.S.; and

WHEREAS, the Law Enforcement Agencies are so located in relation to each other that it is to the advantage of each to receive and extend mutual aid in the form of law enforcement services and resources to adequately respond to continuing, multi-jurisdictional criminal activity, so as to protect the public peace and safety, and preserve the lives and property of the citizens.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF CLEWISTON, FLORIDA, THAT:

- SECTION 1. The attached Mutual Aid Agreement Between the Hendry County Sheriff's Office and Clewiston Police Department is approved.
- SECTION 2. The Police Chief is hereby authorized and directed to sign the attached Agreement on behalf of the Clewiston Police Department.

MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT

Between the HENDRY COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE and CLEWISTON POLICE DEPARTMENT

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the subscribing law enforcement agencies are so located in relation to each other that it is to the advantage of each to receive and extend mutual aid in the form of law enforcement services and resources to adequately respond to:

- 1. Continuing, multi-jurisdictional law enforcement problems, so as to protect the public peace and safety, and preserve the lives and property of the people, and,
- 2. Intensive situations including, but not limited to emergencies as defined under Section 252.34, F.S.; and,

WHEREAS, the Hendry County Sheriff's Office and the Clewiston Police Department have the authority under Chapter 23, Part I, F.S., <u>The Florida Mutual Aid Act</u>, to enter into a combined mutual aid agreement for law enforcement service which:

- 1. Permits voluntary cooperation and assistance of a routine law enforcement nature across jurisdictional lines, inter-agency training, and;
- 2. Provides for rendering of assistance in a civil disturbance or other emergency as defined in Section 252.34, F.S.

Now, therefore, the parties agree as follows, to-wit:

SECTION 1. PROVISIONS FOR VOLUNTARY COOPERATION

Each of the aforesaid law enforcement agencies hereby approve and enter into this agreement whereby each of the agencies may request and render law enforcement assistance to the other in dealing with any violations of Florida Statutes to include, but not necessarily be limited to, investigating homicides, sex offenses, robberies, assaults, burglaries, larcenies, motor vehicle thefts, bomb threats and location of suspected devices, drug violations pursuant to Chapter 893, F.S., backup services during patrol activities, and inter-agency task forces and/or joint investigations.

SECTION 2. PROVISIONS FOR OPERATIONAL ASSISTANCE

Each of the aforesaid law enforcement agencies hereby approve and enter into this agreement whereby each of the agencies may request and render law enforcement assistance to the other to include, but not necessarily be limited to, dealing with civil disturbances, large protect demonstrations, fires, natural or man-made disasters, sporting events, concerts, and incidents requiring the utilization of specialized units.

SECTION 3. PROCEDURE FOR REQUESTING ASSISTANCE

In the event that a party to this agreement is in need of assistance as set forth above, an authorized representative of the agency requesting assistance shall notify the agency head or designee from whom such assistance is requested. The agency head or his authorized designee whose assistance is sought shall evaluate the situation and his available resources; and will respond in a manner they deem appropriate.

The agency head in whose jurisdiction assistance is being rendered may determine who is authorized to lend assistance in their jurisdiction, for how long such assistance is authorized and for what purpose such authority is granted. This authority may be granted either verbally or in writing as the particular situation dictates.

No officer, deputy, or appointee shall be empowered under this agreement to operate outside the agency's jurisdiction without prior approval of the agency head having normal jurisdiction.

However, while outside their jurisdiction at the Hendry County Jail or other Sheriff's Office facility, Clewiston Police Officers processing arrests for matters that occurred within the jurisdiction of the City of Clewiston shall be empowered to perform duties related to the arrest, such as the reading of implied consent, collection of evidence, and any other law enforcement duty related to the arrest.

The agency head's decision in these matters shall be final.

SECTION 4. COMMAND AND SUPERVISORY RESPONSIBILITY

The personnel and equipment that are assigned by the assisting agency head shall be under the immediate command of a supervising officer designated by the assisting agency head. Such supervising officer shall be under the direct supervision and command of the agency head or designee of the agency requesting assistance.

Conflicts:

Whenever an officer, deputy sheriff, or other appointee is rendering assistance pursuant to this agreement, the officer, deputy sheriff, or other appointee shall abide by and be subject to the rules and regulations, personnel policies, general orders and standard operating procedures of their own employer. If any such rule, regulation, personnel policy, general order, or standing operating procedure is contradicted, contravened, or otherwise in conflict with a direct order of a superior officer of the requesting agency, then such rule, regulation, personnel policy, general

order, and standing operating procedure shall control and shall supersede the direct order.

Handling of Complaints:

Whenever there is cause to believe that a complaint has arisen as a result of a cooperative effort as it may pertain to this agreement, the agency head or designee of the requesting agency shall be responsible for the documentation of said complaint to ascertain at a minimum:

- 1) The identity of the complainant.
- 2) An address where the complaining party can be contacted.
- 3) The specific allegation.
- 4) The identity of the employee accused without regard to agency affiliation.

If it is determined that the accused is an employee of the assisting agency, the above information, with all pertinent documentation gathered during the receipt and processing of the complaint, shall be forwarded without delay to the agency head or designee of the assisting agency for administrative review. The requesting agency may conduct a review of the complaint to determine if any factual basis for the complaint exists and/or whether any of the employees of the requesting agency violated any of their agency's policies and procedures.

SECTION 5. LIABILITY

Each party engaging in any mutual cooperation and assistance, pursuant to this agreement, agrees to assume responsibility for the acts, omissions, or conduct of such party's own employees while engaged in rendering such aid pursuant to this agreement, subject to the provisions of Section 768.28, F.S., where applicable.

SECTION 6. POWERS, PRIVILEGES, IMMUNITIES, AND COSTS

- A. Employees of the Clewiston Police Department when actually engaging in mutual cooperation and assistance outside of their jurisdictional limits but inside the state, under the terms of this agreement, shall, pursuant to the provisions of Section 23.127(1), F.S., have the same powers, duties, rights, privileges, and immunities as if the employee was performing duties inside the employee's political subdivision in which normally employed.
- B Each party agrees to furnish necessary personnel, equipment, resources, and facilities; and, to render services to each other party to the agreement as set forth above; provided, however, that no party shall be required to deplete unreasonably its own personnel, equipment, resources, facilities, and services in furnishing mutual aid.
- C. A political subdivision that furnishes aid pursuant to this agreement must bear the cost of loss or damage to that equipment and must pay any expense incurred in the operation and maintenance of that equipment.
- D. The political subdivision furnishing aid pursuant to this agreement shall compensate its appointees/employees during the time such aid is rendered and shall defray the actual travel and maintenance expenses of its employees while they are rendering such aid, including any amounts paid or due for compensation due to personal injury or death while such employees are engaged in rendering such aid.
- E. The privileges and immunities from liability, exemption from laws, ordinances, and rules and all pension, insurance, relief, disability, worker's
 - compensation, salary, death and other benefits that apply to the activities of employees of an agency when performing the employees duties within the territorial limits of the employee's agency apply to the employee to the same degree, manner, and extent while engaged in the performance of the employees duties extraterritorially under the provisions of this mutual aid agreement. The provisions of this section shall apply with equal effect to paid, volunteer and auxiliary/reserve employees.
- F. Nothing herein shall prevent the requesting agency from requesting supplement appropriations from the governing authority having budgeting jurisdiction to reimburse the assisting agency for any actual costs or expenses incurred by the assisting agency performing hereunder.

SECTION 7. INSURANCE

Each party shall provide satisfactory proof of liability insurance by one or more of the means specified in Section 768.28(15), F.S., in an amount which is, in the judgment of the governing body of that party, at least adequate to cover the risk to which that party may be

exposed. Should the insurance coverage, however provided, of any party be canceled or undergo material changes, that party shall notify all parties to this agreement of such change within ten (10) days of receipt of notice or actual knowledge of such change.

SECTION 8. EFFECTIVE DATE

This agreement shall take effect upon execution and approval by the hereinafter-named agency heads of the parties to this agreement and will continue in full force and effect, unless terminated by any or all of the parties according to the further terms hereof. The time limit for this agreement shall run through midnight **January 1**, **2029**. Under no circumstances may this agreement be renewed, amended, or extended except by mutual written agreement.

SECTION 9. CANCELLATION

Any party may cancel its participation in this agreement upon delivery of thirty (30) days written notice to the other party. Cancellation will be at the direction of any of the subscribing parties.

This document embodies the entire agreement between the parties hereto.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU) BETWEEN

City of Clewiston, Florida

AND

BETTER TOGETHER, A FLORIDA NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATION

The above listed parties enter into this MOU, effective date of last party signature:

WHEREAS, Better Together is a non-profit corporation with its headquarters in Collier County, FL., that provides services through two programs: Better Families and Better Jobs, with the overall goal of keeping families together.

WHEREAS, Better Together desires to provide such services to City of Clewiston, Florida ("Community Partner") to assist in its mission; and

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto enter this Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") in accordance with the following terms and conditions and statement of purpose:

1. Purpose.

The purpose of this MOU is to provide organizational support and/or related services through our Better Families program to Partner Program by providing children ages 0-17 with a temporary loving home with a vetted and background-checked host family and helping their parents work to build a better life. Parents enter the Better Families program voluntarily while family advocates guide them as they work to get back on their feet. We help parents obtain employment opportunities through our Better Jobs program by connecting individuals to a job coach. The goal of Better Together is to prevent child abuse and neglect by providing a non-threatening safety net for families with children and empowering parents to help themselves, addressing the root causes that that led to their crisis, and keeping families together.

2. <u>Duties and Responsibilities of Better Together.</u>

Better Together agrees to the following duties and responsibilities:

- a. Fund the services to be provided.
- b. Ensure its employees and volunteers receive trauma-informed basic training in child abuse and neglect consistent with Department of Children and Family ("DCF") standards for detection, reporting, prevention, and counseling.
- c. Ensure its employees and volunteers make mandatory reports of child abuse, neglect, or abandonment (per Section 39.201, Florida Statutes).
- d. Recruit, screen, train, and oversee volunteers through partner churches and other entities to serve families in crisis, consistent with DCF statutes and rules, to reduce the risk of child abuse, abandonment, and neglect.
- e. Ensure all employees and volunteers providing direct support to families successfully satisfy VECHS system Chapter 435. F. S, Level 2 screenings.

3. Duties and responsibilities of Community Partner

Partner Organization agrees to the following duties and responsibilities after obtaining a signed release of information by the parent/guardian:

- a. Work with approved screened staff of Community Partner to provide access for Better Together to families seeking assistance, whose situation does not warrant a formal investigation or diversion services providing name, contact information, and relevant information to the families circumstances.
- b. Provide relevant information on an as needed basis as more information might be needed.
- c. Invite Better Together employees to participate in staff meetings where family being served is a topic of discussion.
- d. Update Better Together staff on progress of clients being served by both parties.

4. General Conditions Governing the MOU

- a. Each party shall be solely responsible for the negligent act or omissions of its own staff, volunteers, or persons under its authority and direction.
- b. Each party agrees to maintain the confidentiality of any client information.
- c. Each party will support and make every reasonable effort to work collaboratively with the other party in the implementation of this MOU.

5. Duration of the Memorandum of Understanding and Termination

a. This MOU shall begin when signed by all parties and remain in effect for 2 years, or until terminated by either party without cause upon 10 days' written notice or immediately with cause.

Project Title: FY2023 JAG – (JAGC)

Project Goals:

Clewiston Police Department (CPD)

The Clewiston Police Department is the primary law enforcement authority for the City of Clewiston, Hendry County, Florida. Clewiston is a 4.68 square mile rural community located 60 miles west of West Palm Beach, Florida and 60 miles east of Fort Myers, Florida, with a residential population of 7,198 (City-data.com).

The City of Clewiston seeks to utilize the Federal Fiscal Year 2023 Justice Assistance
Grant (JAG-C) Program to enhance technology infrastructure for several areas of the
police department. This project is an ongoing part of modernizing and strengthening the
communication center, computer server room, criminal investigations, and operation
section.

Strategies:

• The City of Clewiston will assign a project manager that will oversee the purchasing of the maintenance contract, equipment, and training in compliance with grant guidelines and procurement standards.

Project Identifiers

• Communications Center:

Upgrading the current 5-monitor layout to a 6-monitor stacked orientation will better utilize the workspace, and the extra monitor will address seeing the CAD Map for each workstation. The new monitors will be 27-inch screens stacked in 2x2x3 format with fixed mounts. Due to the additional power draw due to the new monitor configuration, two additional higher-wattage UPS will be needed.

• IT / Server Room:

Due to upgrades to the main domain and file backup servers, the department has exceeded the current battery backup systems or UPS capabilities. Currently, four UPS units are needed in the main server rack. Due to wattage constraints, other devices such as network switches, internet routers, and other gateways are not included and have a power cycle during a change from the main power to the generator, causing a delay in connectivity. Upgrading to three higher wattage/output batteries to address the servers used by the department and will consolidate space for any future devices.

• Criminal Investigation Division:

A workstation is needed to replace the current computer that will be reallocated for data forensics. The DataPilot system will allow investigators to conduct searches on data/digital devices for investigation purposes. The purchase of the DataPilot platform includes a mobile in-field device, software license for a single computer, training, and two-year licensing.

• Animal Services:

We are replacing the two used workstations and older laptops with new Panasonic Toughbook laptops with desktop docking stations and monitors. The Animal Control Officers will use the laptops as their primary computer systems to complete reports and other work functions.

• VHF Radio Project:

The police department maintains a secondary radio system that, if the primary system is rendered inoperative, a redundant system acts as a backup, ensuring that communication remains uninterrupted. Replacing the current VHF radio repeater with a newer system will play a critical role in maintaining reliable communication for the city police department and ensuring that other city departments can respond effectively to a wide range of incidents and emergencies.

SERVICE AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT shall be effective as of the 1st day of October, 2024 and is entered into by and between the CITY OF CLEWISTON, Hendry County, Florida, a municipal corporation of the State of Florida, whose address is 115 West Ventura Avenue, Clewiston, Florida 33440 (hereinafter referred to as the "City"), and the CLEWISTON MUSEUM, Inc., a Florida Corporation Not-for-Profit, whose address is 109 Central Avenue, Clewiston, Florida 33440 (hereinafter referred to as the "Museum").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the City, by and through its City Commission, desires to use the Museum's conference room for meetings; and,

WHEREAS, the Museum wishes to provide access to its historical outdoor displays at no cost to the public; and

WHEREAS, the City, by and through its City Commission, determined that the use of the Museum's conference room for public meetings, and the provision of access to the Museum's historical outdoor displays at no cost to the public constitutes a public purpose.

NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the City and the Museum hereby agree as follows:

SECTION I-SCOPE OF SERVICE

The Museum shall:

- (A) allow the City to use the Museum's conference room for public meetings when the conference room is not in use by the Museum. The City must request the use of the conference room in advance; and
 - (B) provide the public with access to its historical outdoor displays at no cost.

SECTION II-COMPENSATION

- (A) The City shall compensate the Museum, upon execution of this Agreement, in the amount of Five Thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars. Payment shall be made in full.
- (B) The City shall not charge the Museum for water, sewer and electrical utilities, as provided by the City Utility Department, for the period beginning October 1, 2024, through September 30, 2025.

SECTION III-TERM OF AGREEMENT

This Agreement shall commence on October 1, 2024 and will expire on September 30, 2025.

SECTION IV- ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties hereto and shall supersede, replace and nullify any and all prior agreements or understandings, written or oral, relating to the matters set forth herein, and any such prior agreements or understandings shall have no force or effect whatsoever on this Agreement.

SECTION V-NOTICES AND ADDRESS OF RECORD

(A) All notices required and/or made pursuant to this Agreement to be given by the Museum to the City shall be in writing and shall be given by the United States Postal Service certified mail, postage prepaid, overnight delivery via a recognized national carrier or hand-delivery addressed to the following City address of record:

(B) All notices required and/or made pursuant to this Agreement to be given by the City to the Museum shall be made in writing and shall be given by the United States Postal Service certified mail, postage prepaid, overnight delivery via a recognized national carrier or hand-delivery addressed to the following address of record of the Museum:

(C) Either party may change its address of record by written notice to the other party given in accordance with the requirements of this Section.

SECTION VI-TERMINATION

This Agreement may be terminated by the City, or by the Museum, at their convenience by giving Sixty (60) days' written notice to the other party. In the event of termination by the Museum, the City shall be entitled to a pro-rated refund of the Compensation paid to Museum.

SECTION VII-MODIFICATIONS

Modifications to this Agreement shall only be valid when issued in writing and properly executed by both parties.

CLEWISTON SIKES BUILDING LEASE AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into to be effective the 1st day of October, 2024, by and between the CITY OF CLEWISTON, FLORIDA, a municipal corporation existing under the laws of the State of Florida, hereinafter referred to as "LESSOR", and LITTLE DISCIPLES LEARNING CENTER, INC., a Florida corporation, hereinafter referred to as "LESSEE". In consideration of the promises and covenants by each made and to be kept to the other, the LESSOR and the LESSEE do hereby agree as follows:

1. Lease Property:

The LESSOR hereby leases to the LESSEE the following described real property and improvements ("the Property"):

Block 209, General Plan of Clewiston, Florida, as revised September 7, 1937, according to the Plat thereof in Plat Book 2, pages 71-78, inclusive, Public Records of Hendry County.

Together with all buildings and improvements now or hereafter located on said lands, and the furniture, furnishings, fixtures and equipment therein.

2. Term of Lease:

The Lease shall commence upon the execution hereof by both the LESSOR and the LESSEE and shall continue thereafter for a period of one (1) year. The Lease shall end on September 30, 2025, unless terminated earlier.

3. Rent:

The LESSEE shall pay to the LESSOR, as rent for the Property, the sum of \$550.00 plus applicable sales tax per month. The rent for the first month shall be due on or before the execution hereof, and a like sum shall be due thereafter on the first day of each subsequent month during the term of this Agreement.

4. Termination of Lease:

Disregarding any other provisions of this Agreement, either party may, at its sole discretion, with or without cause, terminate this lease at any time by giving 60 days prior written notice of that intent to the other party.

5. Condition of Property:

Lessor makes no representation or warranty regarding the condition of the Property. Lessee takes the Property "as is" and is responsible for meeting all city, county, state and federal rules and regulations.

6. Use of Leased Property:

The LESSEE shall use the leased premises only as a day-care facility, and for no other purpose.

7. <u>Utilities, Licenses, Fees and Compliance with Applicable Law:</u>

The LESSEE shall be responsible for, and shall pay in a timely manner, all utility services, licenses and operating fees required in conjunction with the use of the Property by the LESSEE.

The LESSEE shall comply with all applicable city, state and federal laws, and all applicable agency regulations.

8. Repairs and Maintenance:

The LESSEE shall be responsible for, and shall make in a timely manner, all necessary repairs to the inside of the Property, including but not limited to plumbing and electrical, and maintain the Property in the same condition that exists upon execution of this Agreement, wear and tear excluded.

The LESSOR shall maintain and repair the exterior of the Property, and maintain the air conditioning and exterior fixtures and other equipment. The LESSOR shall maintain the lawn and landscaping. The LESSOR shall provide Pest Control Services for the Property.

9. <u>Damage by Fire or Other Casualty</u>.

If the Property is damaged by fire or other casualty to the extent of ten percent (10%) or more of the value, the LESSOR shall have the option to rebuild and repair the Property, or to terminate this Lease; if damaged to a lesser extent, the LESSOR shall repair the Property. In the event of damage by fire or other casualty, the rent payable under this lease shall abate in proportion to the impairment of the use that can reasonably be made of the property until the property is rebuilt and repaired (or until the Lease is terminated).

10. Structural Changes:

The LESSEE shall not make any structural changes to the Property, without the prior written consent of the LESSOR.

11. Access by Lessor:

The LESSOR, or its agents, may enter, inspect and make such repairs to the Property as the LESSOR may reasonably desire, at all reasonable times, but the right to make such repairs shall impose no greater burden upon the LESSOR than is provided for in this Agreement.

12. Assignment or Sub-leasing:

The LESSEE shall not assign or sub-lease the Property, or any portion thereof.

13. Insurance & Indemnification:

The LESSOR may maintain such fire and other casualty insurance on the Property as it may so desire. LESSEE shall pay for and maintain throughout this Lease, liability insurance to protect LESSOR and LESSEE against all claims, judgments, expenses or otherwise, including attorney's fees which may arise as a result of LESSEE'S use, occupancy, and maintenance of the Property. Said liability insurance shall have limits of not less than \$1,000,000 each Occurrence/\$2,000,000 General Aggregate, and \$100,000 damage to rented premises coverage. The insurance shall name the LESSOR as an additional insured party and contain a provision that in the event it is

cancelled, notice will be delivered to LESSOR. LESSEE shall provide LESSOR with a certificate showing said insurance to be in full force and effect at the commencement of this Lease.

Notwithstanding the foregoing insurance coverages, LESSEE hereby agrees to indemnify, defend, save, and hold harmless LESSOR from and against any and all claims, damages, personal injuries, and/or deaths, liabilities, fines, liens, encumbrances, penalties, losses, and expenses (including, but not limited to, attorneys' fees and costs and all trial and appellate level proceedings, whether or not a lawsuit is commenced) arising out of LESSEE'S use of the Premises.

14. Construction:

Pursuant to Section 713.10 <u>Florida Statutes</u>, the LESSEE is specifically prohibited from contracting for any services or materials, or taking any other action which would cause any Construction Lien to attach to the leased property. The LESSOR shall not be liable for any materials or services purchased by the LESSEE.

15. Addresses.

All rent payable and notice given under this Lease to the LESSOR shall be paid and given at 115 West Ventura Avenue, Clewiston, Florida 33440, or at such other place as the LESSOR shall specify in writing. All notices given to LESSEE shall be delivered by hand to the leased premises.

16. Remedies for Breach of Agreement.

If either the LESSOR or the LESSEE fails to perform, or breaches any provision of this Lease and the breach continues for ten (10) days following written notice specifying the breach and corrective steps required, the party giving such notice may terminate this lease by written notice.

17. Ad Valorem Taxes.

Should the leased premises become subject to ad valorem property taxation, LESSEE agrees to pay their prorated share.

18. Public Records:

LESSEE shall comply with Florida public records laws and, in accordance with s.119.0701 F.S., shall specifically:

- A. Keep and maintain public records required by the city to perform the service.
- B. Upon request from the City's custodian of public records, provide the LESSOR with a copy of the requested records or allow the records to be inspected or copied within a reasonable time at a cost that does not exceed the cost provided in F.S. Chapter 119 or as otherwise provided by law.
- C. Ensure that public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements are not disclosed except as authorized by law for the duration of

the Lease term and following completion of the Lease if the LESSEE does not transfer the records to the LESSOR.

D. Upon completion of the Lease, transfer, at no cost to LESSOR, all public records in possession of the LESSEE or keep and maintain public records required by the LESSOR to perform the service. If the LESSEE transfers all public records upon completion of the lease, the LESSEE shall destroy any duplicate public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements. If the LESSEE keeps and maintains public records upon completion, the LESSEE shall meet all applicable requirements for retaining public records. All records stored electronically must be provided to the LESSOR, upon request from the LESSOR's custodian of public records, in a format that is compatible with the information technology systems of the City.

Any tort liability to which LESSOR is exposed under this agreement shall be limited to the extent permitted by applicable law and subject to the provisions and monetary limitations of Section 768.28, Florida Statutes, as may be amended. Nothing in this agreement shall be considered to increase or waive any limits of liability or waive any immunity afforded to LESSOR by Florida Statute, case law, or any other source of law.

HOPE HOSPICE AND COMMUNITY SERVICES, INC LEASE AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into to be effective the 1st day of October, 2024, by and between the CITY OF CLEWISTON, FLORIDA, 115 West Ventura Avenue, Clewiston, Florida, 33440, a municipal corporation existing under the laws of the State of Florida, hereinafter referred to as "LESSOR" and HOPE HOSPICE AND COMMUNITY SERVICES, INC., 9470 Health Park Circle, Fort Myers, Florida 33908, a non-profit corporation existing under the laws of the State of Florida, hereinafter referred to as "LESSEE", in consideration of the promises and covenants by each made and to be kept to the other, the LESSOR and the LESSEE do hereby agree as follows:

1. <u>Lease Property:</u>

The LESSOR hereby leases to the LESSEE the following described real and personal property:

The front office of 1200 South W.C. Owen Avenue (AKA Senior Citizens Building), together with the use of the kitchen facilities as needed.

2. Term of Lease:

The Lease shall commence upon the execution hereof by both the LESSOR and the LESSEE and shall continue thereafter and terminate at the end of the one (1) year (September 30, 2025) term. The date of execution by both parties shall be the first day of the one-year term of the Lease. Disregarding any other provisions of this Lease, either party may, at its sole discretion, with or without cause, terminate this Lease at any time by giving 60 days prior written notice of that intent to the other party.

3. Rent:

The LESSEE shall pay to the LESSOR, as rent for the leased property, the sum of \$495.00 per month (this amount includes utilities). The rent for the first month shall be due on or before the execution hereof, and a like sum shall be due thereafter on the first day of each subsequent month during the term of this Agreement. All rent payable to LESSOR shall be paid at 115 W. Ventura Avenue, Clewiston, Florida 33440.

4. Use of Leased Property:

The LEESEE will make no unlawful, improper, or offensive use of the leased property. The LESSEE will use the leased property for providing a continuum of services for senior citizens.

5. License, Fees, and Compliance with Applicable Law:

The LESSEE shall be responsible for, and pay in a timely manner, all licenses and operating fees required in conjunction with the use of the leased premises by the LESSEE. The LESSEE, in the use of the leased premises, shall comply with all city and county ordinances, and all state and federal laws, and all agency regulations.

6. <u>Structural Changes:</u>

The LESSEE shall not make any structural changes to any improvements leased herein, without the prior written consent of the LESSOR.

7. Access by Lessor:

The LESSOR, or its agent, may enter, inspect and make such repairs to the leased property as the LESSOR may reasonably desire, at all reasonable times, but the right to make such repairs shall impose no greater burden upon the LESSOR than is provided for in this Agreement.

8. Assignment or Sub-leasing:

The LEESEE shall not have the right to assign this Lease or to sub-lease the leased property, or any portion thereof, without the prior written consent of the LESSOR.

9. Repairs:

The LESSOR will maintain the exterior of the buildings on Leased Property, including the roof and exterior walls, in good and substantial repair. The LESSEE will maintain the interior of the Lease Property, including interior ceiling, walls, floors, fixtures, pipes, doors, windows, air conditioning, and other things except which the LESSOR has specified that it will maintain, all in good and substantial repair. The agreements to repair in this paragraph do not apply to any damage caused by fire or casualty.

10. Damage by Fire or Other Casualty:

If the Lease Property is damaged by fire or other casualty to the extent of ten percent, or more, the LESSOR shall have the option to rebuild and repair the Lease Property, or to terminate this Lease; if damaged to a lesser extent, the LESSOR will rebuild and repair. In event of damage by fire or other casualty, the rent payable under this Lease shall abate in proportion to the impairment of the use that can reasonably be made of the property for the purpose permitted by the Lease, until the property is rebuilt and repaired (or until the Lease is terminated, if terminated in accordance with this paragraph).

11. Insurance & Indemnification:

The LESSOR may maintain such fire and other casualty insurance on the leased premises as it may so desire. The LESSEE shall acquire and keep in effect during the entire term of this Lease, liability insurance to protect LESSOR and LESSEE against all claims, judgments, expenses or otherwise, including attorney's fees which may arise as a result of LESSEE'S use, occupancy, and maintenance of the Property. Said liability insurance shall have limits of not less than \$500,000.00 each Occurrence/\$500,000 General Aggregate, and \$100,000 damage to rented premises coverage. The insurance shall name the LESSOR as an additional insured party. The LESSEE shall provide the LESSOR with a Certificate of Insurance verifying such coverage, which Certificate shall provide that the insurance shall not be cancelled without 15 days written notice to the LESSOR. The Certificate of Insurance shall be provided to the LESSOR within ten (10) days after the execution of this Agreement.

Notwithstanding the foregoing insurance coverages, Lessee hereby agrees to indemnify, defend, save, and hold harmless Lessor from and against any and all claims, damages, personal injuries, and/or deaths, liabilities, fines, liens, encumbrances, penalties, losses, and expenses (including, but not limited to, attorneys' fees and costs and all trial and appellate level proceedings, whether or not a lawsuit is commenced) arising out of Lessee's use of the Premises.

The rent payment has been reduced by \$150 per month to pay for this indemnification clause.

12. Mechanic's Liens:

The LESSEE IS specifically prohibited from contracting for any services or materials, or taking any other action which would cause any Construction Lien to attach to the Lease Property. Further, the LESSOR shall not be liable for any materials or services purchased by the LESSEE.

13. Parking:

The LESSEE agrees and understands that the parking area located to the part of the building leased is a common parking area with other tenants, and each tenant has an equal right to use said parking lot in a reasonable manner.

14. Public Records:

LESSEE shall comply with Florida public records laws and, in accordance with s.119.0701 F.S., shall specifically:

- A. Keep and maintain public records required by the City to perform the service.
- B. Upon request from the City's custodian of public records, provide the LESSOR with a copy of the requested records or allow the records to be inspected or copied within a reasonable time at a cost that does not exceed the cost provided in F.S. Chapter 119 or as otherwise provided by law.
- C. Ensure that public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements are not disclosed except as authorized by law for the duration of the Lease term and following completion of the Lease if the LESSEE does not transfer the records to the LESSOR.
- D. Upon completion of the Lease, transfer, at no cost to LESSOR, all public records in possession of the LESSEE or keep and maintain public records required by the LESSOR to perform the service. If the LESSEE transfers all public records upon completion of the lease, the LESSEE shall destroy any duplicate public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements. If the LESSEE keeps and maintains public records upon completion, the LESSEE shall meet all applicable requirements for retaining public records. All records stored electronically must be provided to the LESSOR, upon request from the LESSOR's custodian of public

records, in a format that is compatible with the information technology systems of the City.

15. Miscellaneous:

The Agreement contains the entire understanding of the parties and shall not be modified except in writing signed by both parties.

16. Sovereign Immunity:

Any tort liability to which LESSOR is exposed under this agreement shall be limited to the extent permitted by applicable law and subject to the provisions and monetary limitations of Section 768.28, Florida Statutes, as may be amended. Nothing in this agreement shall be considered to increase or waive any limits of liability or waive any immunity afforded to LESSOR by Florida Statute, case law, or any other source of law.

moving down the river.

"When B was taken out, all the sediments that were held for 30 years got flushed down to C," he explained "When C was removed, all the sediments were flushed down to D."

He said the velocity the water was moving has made the top of the river wider as the rushing water eroded the banks.

'Captain Steve" Tipurt of Kissimmee River Shores said they welcome a plan to keep more water in the river, but are concerned about high flows after a storm.

"Our marina has less than a foot of water and most of that is silt from the backwashes of the high waters," he said. "Boats are in the mud. We just want to see it managed well. Everybody wants to see the water back up."

Phil Holden of Lorida said the

velocity of the water that came down the river after Ian, along with the height of the water, damaged the flood plain.

"Oaks that had been there for 100 vears and cypress that had been there for 100 years are laying in the river now," he said.

Surveys and aerials show that bank hadn't changed in 100s of years, he said. In three years, it changed 10 feet.

"When you open that valve and you flush water down so fast, you couldn't paddle a canoe against it," he said.

"We rebuilt our seawalls in 2018," said Todd Bledsoe of Hidden Acres Estates. "USACE and SFWMD gave us height requirement."

He said the water was 5 feet higher than the sea wall and eroded the ground under the sea wall.

"It would have been a lot easier if we hadn't dug the ditch in the first

place," said Dr. Paul Gray of Florida Audubon. "We know Ian was an extraordinary event," he added.

Flows coming out of the Kissimmee Valley are much higher than they were in the 1940s due to the development in that area, he added. (The C&S Flood Control project was developed in response to the Great Florida Flood in 1948.)

Rapid flow of flood water also decreases the oxygen level in the water. Those who live on the river also said thousands of fish were killed when the flood water was rapidly pumped down the river after Ian.

ANNEXATION AGREEMENT

THIS ANNEXATION AGREEMENT (hereinafter "Agreement") dated this _____day of __2024, effective as provided herein, is by and between United States Sugar Corporation, 111 Ponce de Leon Avenue, Clewiston, FL 33440 (hereinafter referred to as "OWNER"), and the CITY OF CLEWISTON, a municipal corporation of the State of Florida (hereinafter referred to as "CITY") (collectively referred to as "PARTIES").

WHEREAS, OWNER is the owner of a parcel of property described on the attached Exhibit "A" which is made a part hereof (hereinafter, "PROPERTY").

See Attached Exhibit "A"

WHEREAS, OWNER petitioned the CITY to annex the PROPERTY into the CITY on the terms and conditions stated herein; and

WHEREAS, the PARTIES wish to set forth the terms of this agreement and understanding as of the date hereof for their mutual protection and convenience and to establish the mechanisms for addressing any matters relating to the annexation and development of the PROPERTY not addressed herein, which effort will entail some resources in time, energy and money of the PARTIES.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein and for other good and valuable consideration to the other, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged by each party, the PARTIES do hereby agree as follows:

- 1. General Recitals and Findings of Fact
 - 1.1. United States Sugar Corporation is the OWNER of the subject property.
 - 1.2. OWNER and CITY represent that no obligation or undertaking under this Annexation Agreement is prohibited by contractual agreement with any other person or entity or is otherwise contrary to the laws of the CITY, Hendry County, and the State of Florida.
 - 1.3. CITY finds that the annexation of the PROPERTY will be a substantial benefit to the CITY.
 - 1.4 No part of the PROPERTY is included within the boundary of any other incorporated municipality.
 - 1.5 Annexation of the PROPERTY meets the requirements of Section 171.044, F.S., and will not result in the creation of an enclave, and the PROPERTY is a reasonable compact addition to the CITY.

- 1.6 The County regulations remain in effect pursuant to Section 171.062, F.S. until the CITY adopts a future land use category for the PROPERTY and an appropriate zoning category.
- 1.7 CITY and OWNER recognize the benefits of clarifying with reasonable certainty the planning, development, and zoning parameters of the PROPERTY.

2. Future Land Use Category

- 2.1 OWNER has submitted an application for a text amendment for a Future Land Use Category titled Employment Hub, and a map amendment to apply the Employment HUB Future Land Use Category to the property described in **Exhibit "A"**.
- 2.1. CITY will use its best efforts to schedule and consider the adoption of a text amendment to create the Employment Hub, as a Future Land Use category (FLUC) and a Future Land Use map amendment for the PROPERTY to place the subject property in the Employment Hub, FLUC in accordance with the requirements of Chapter 163, F.S.
- 2.2. Should CITY decide that it cannot support or adopt the Employment Hub Future Land Use Category and the map amendment for the PROPERTY, CITY will allow the contraction of the property, if appropriate, in accordance with the process set forth in Chapter 171, F.S. and as provided herein.

3. Zoning

- 3.1. OWNER has submitted an application for a Planned Unit Development (PUD) on 438 acres that will permit a maximum of 4,400,000square feet of industrial, commercial (office and retail), cultural use (train museum), and agriculture as an ongoing interim use until the property develops. The proposed uses include, but are not limited to the following:
 - a. Full-Service Truck Stop,
 - b. Hotels/motels.
 - c. Restaurants (all types including fast food),
 - d. Indoor and Outdoor Storage, including refrigerated storage,
 - e. Warehouse, includes public, private, mini-warehouse, and High-Cube
 - f. Plant growing facilities and storage, including greenhouses, and plant research facilities,
- g. Commercial and non-commercial schools, including private schools, and charter schools.
 - h. Manufacturing,
 - i. Propane and Gas Distribution facilities,
 - j. Cold Storage warehousing and processing plant,
 - k. Freight and Cargo handling establishment,
 - I. Building and Materials Sales
 - m. Vehicle, Aircraft, and equipment repair,
 - n. Wireless communication and communications tower(s)
- 3.2. CITY agrees that a PUD is an appropriate zoning district for the **Exhibit "A"** property. CITY will use its best efforts to schedule and consider the adoption of a PUD concurrently, as permitted by Section 163.3184(12), F.S., with the adoption of the Future Land Use Map

(FLUM) amendment that includes the uses described in paragraph 3.1. at all required duly noticed public hearings.

- 3.3. Should CITY decide that it cannot support or adopt the PUD zoning category for the PROPERTY, CITY will agenda a contraction of the property in accordance with Florida Statute 171.051, F.S. and as provided herein.
- 3.4 The property currently includes bona fide agricultural uses. The property can continue to be used for bona fide agricultural purposes until the CITY approves a subdivision plat for the property. Once a plat is approved for a portion of the property, the property that is the subject of the plat will discontinue bona fide agricultural uses that are entitled to an agricultural exemption. Nothing herein will prevent community farms, vegetable gardens, or other individual agricultural uses to continue as permitted by the PUD. Certain agricultural uses such as stables and equestrian facilities can be included in the PUD. The bona fide agricultural uses that can occur prior to the approval of a subdivision plat include but are not limited to, row crops, citrus, sugar cane, and cattle. Any portion of the property that is not the subject of a subdivision plat can continue to have bona fide agricultural uses.
- 3.5. OWNER and CITY may decide at some later date to annex additional lands or add additional land to the PUD. The CITY and OWNER will determine the appropriate land uses for the additional lands at the time of annexation and/or at the time of inclusion in the PUD.
- 3.6 The PUD will permit excess fill to be transported out of the PUD. No impact fee or other transportation fee will be assessed for the transport of fill internal to or outside the PUD.

4. Transportation

4.1. The CITY and OWNER agree that the property will be developed in phases. The traffic impact statement for the zoning will consider the short-term impact (five years) of the development. An updated Traffic Impact Statement will be provided before the development of future phases for the phase under consideration.

4.2. Impact Fees

The City may decide to adopt impact fees in the future for roads, schools, parks, Fire, EMS, or other public services. OWNER is entitled to impact fee credits if and when they are created for any land dedication, site planning and design, construction, or other exaction imposed prior to the adoption of impact fees to defray public infrastructure costs. The value of any land dedication of land for which credit is sought shall be based on the fair market value as required by Section 163.31801(5)(a), F.S.. The valuation of any contribution or construction of improvements shall be based on actual costs incurred. The City will review the cost estimate for the improvement prior to the initiation of construction. The OWNER will periodically provide invoices to the CITY as the work proceeds..

5. Wastewater

5.1. OWNER will require approximately .356 MGD of wastewater treatment capacity at buildout of the development. OWNER will require 0.1 MGD for the first phase which is anticipated to begin in 2025.

- 5.2. The City is in the process of expanding its wastewater capacity and upon completion and approval by DEP City will be able to accommodate OWNER's .356 MGD. The .356 MGD will be reserved for OWNER.
- 5.3. OWNER will provide a phasing schedule to the utility department which shall be updated on an annual basis to assist the CITY in updating the utility capital improvement program. The CITY commits that it will make the necessary improvements to the wastewater collection system to ensure that the wastewater demands of the development will be met in accordance with the phasing schedule submitted to the CITY contingent on the annual appropriation and budgeting authority for such a project as provided by the City Commission.
- 5.4. OWNER will pay the applicable wastewater connection fee in effect at the time of building permit issuance for the industrial, hotel, flex, or commercial building under consideration. OWNER is not required to pay the utility fee for any public use that may seek to develop within the property.
- 5.5. CITY will extend the wastewater collection system to the PROPERTY at a location to be mutually determined contingent on the annual appropriation and budgeting authority for such a project as provided by the City Commission.
- 5.6. OWNER agrees to extend the wastewater collection system through the development on a phased basis to address OWNER's needs. Such wastewater collection system shall meet CITY design criteria and engineering standards. CITY shall have a right to inspect and approve construction prior to acceptance. Once each phase of the wastewater collection system is approved by the by CITY and FDEP for use, OWNER will dedicate the system to the CITY, and CITY will assume operation and maintenance responsibilities for the internal wastewater collection system.
- 5.7. Should CITY determine that the internal wastewater collection system should be upgraded or enlarged for the benefit of the CITY or third parties, CITY shall fund or otherwise provide credits equal to the differential value between the existing system and the upgrade or enlargement including any additional gravity sanitary sewer collection lines, pump, or lift stations, and/or force mains required in whole or in part due to the demands of the CITY or third parties contingent on the annual appropriation and budgeting authority for such a project as provided by the City Commission.

6.0 Water

- 6.1. The development will require approximately 0.356 MGD of potable water at build-out. The OWNER will require 0.1 MGD for the first phase anticipated to begin in 2025.
- 6.2 CITY commits that it can provide 0.356 MGD in 2025. CITY commits that it will take all necessary steps and make all necessary capital improvements to ensure that the required capacity will be available for the first phase contingent on the annual appropriation and budgeting authority for such a project as provided by the City Commission The 0.356 MGD will be reserved for the OWNER.
- 6.3. OWNER will cap irrigation wells not required for irrigation in the project as development proceeds. CITY and OWNER agree that OWNER will not use potable water for irrigation purposes. On-site wells and water management lakes and other alternatives permitted by the South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) will be used for irrigation. OWNER and CITY will mutually explore the potential for Irrigation Quality Water to be provided by CITY to

the PROPERTY. Bona Fide agricultural uses can continue to use on-site wells to meet agricultural demand.

- 6.4. OWNER will provide a phasing schedule to the utility department which shall be updated on an annual basis to assist CITY in updating the utility capital improvement program. CITY commits that it will make the necessary improvements to the water system to continue to provide potable water consistent with the phasing schedule provided by OWNER as required by Paragraph 5.3 contingent on the annual appropriation and budgeting authority for such a project as provided by the City Commission..
- 6.5. OWNER will pay the applicable water connection fees in effect at the time of building permit. OWNER is not required to pay the utility fee for any public use.
- 6.6. CITY will extend the potable water distribution system to the PROPERTY at a location to be mutually determined. Such potable water distribution system shall meet CITY design criteria and engineering standards. CITY shall have a right to inspect and approve construction prior to acceptance. Once each phase of the potable water distribution system is completed and cleared for use by CITY and FDEP, OWNER will dedicate the system and CITY will assume operation and maintenance responsibility for the internal potable water distribution system. Should the CITY determine that a water storage tank is required, the OWNER will provide a suitable site within the PROPERTY to the CITY, and CITY will provide the required storage tank contingent on the annual appropriation and budgeting authority for such a project as provided by the City Commission. The site shall not exceed three acres in size. CITY will provide sufficient buffering and security for the water tank.
- 6.7. Should CITY determine that the potable water system needs to be upgraded or enlarged for the benefit of CITY or third parties, CITY shall fund or otherwise provide credits equal to the differential value between the existing system and the upgrade or enlargement including any transmission lines, additional pump stations, and storage facilities required in whole or in part to the demands of CITY or third parties.

7. Surface Water Management

- 7.1. OWNER agrees to obtain all necessary Environmental Resource Permits (ERP) for the development of the PROPERTY.
- 7.2. OWNER will address all water quality, water storage, and attenuation requirements included in the ERP by the SFWMD.
- 7.3The CITY has no current plans to create a stormwater management fee. If one is adopted in the future the CITY will assess the subject property consistent with all other similarly situated properties that are maintaining their internal water management system consistent with all duly adopted rules and regulations of South Florida Water Management District. The property will not be subject to any surface water management fees or assessment that do not take into account the water quality, water storage, floodplain mitigation and other water management measures provided on the property and said fee or assessment must meet the dual rational nexus test.

8. Electric Service

- 8.1 City agrees to provide electric service to that portion of the annexed properties falling within the city's services area.
- 8.2 If/when appropriate City will extend the electrical distribution line to a site adjacent delivery point to be mutually determined. The CITY will work with OWNER to provide service in a timely manner to serve the development of the PROPERTY. Arterial lines aside from the delivery point shall be the responsibility of the owner.

9. Independent District.

- 9.1 CITY agrees to work with any Special District that may be created.
- 9.2. OWNER and CITY agree that OWNER may apply to create a a special district for any purposes permitted by Chapter 189, Florida Statutes in accordance with the requirements of Chapter 189, F.S.
- 9.3 OWNER and CITY agree that OWNER may apply to create a Uniform Community Development District with all of the general and thereafter special powers permitted by Chapter 190, F.S. in accordance with the requirements of Chapter 190, F.S.

10. Roads

- 10.1. OWNER and/or District agree to construct all internal roads necessary within the PROPERTY to serve the needs of the PROPERTY. "District" refers to any district created as referenced in Section 9 of this Agreement subject to CITY design, engineering standards, and approval.
- 10.2. If OWNER voluntarily dedicates property to CITY for road right of way and related purposes including but not limited to road drainage, sidewalks, and bus pull-offs, if accepted, the OWNER will then be entitled to credits from any future road impact fee or other transportation mitigation funding mechanism adopted by CITY for the value of the right of way. The credits shall be based on the value of the right of way at the time credits are sought. If a right-of-way reservation is required, the reservation will be for a period not to exceed ten years at which time the reservation will terminate. The government entity that acquires the right of way must pay for the property as required by the Florida Constitution and the United States Constitution as though the property is part of the parent parcel and not as right of way.
- 10.3 The PUD will include the cross sections for local and collector roads within the project.
- 10.4 CITY will not undertake a retroactive or cumulative analysis of the transportation impacts. The project will be vested from transportation concurrency should the optional transportation concurrency element be included in the CITY comprehensive plan pursuant to Section 163.3180, F.S. as it may be amended.

11. General Government Services

11.1. OWNER and CITY shall determine what lands will be made available for acquisition by CITY for general government services. If the CITY requires the dedication of land, the dedication must be consistent with the dual rational nexus test.

- 11.2. All lands dedicated for general government services must be used for general government services. No lands dedicated to or acquired by CITY can be used for purposes that are incompatible with the PUD such as outdoor fleet storage, solid waste transfer station, electrical substation, wastewater treatment plant, water treatment plant, and other intense governmental facilities. The lands dedicated for general government services can be used for Fire and EMS. If the property is not used for a general government service within ten (10) years of dedication, the property shall revert back to US Sugar, and CITY shall provide all necessary documentation necessary to effectively convey marketable title to US Sugar.
- 11.3 CITY will include the property within the solid waste collection area served by the CITY.

12. General Provisions

- 12.1 If the Future Land Use Map and PUD zoning are not adopted in accordance with the provisions set forth herein within eighteen (18) months of this Agreement, OWNER and CITY agree that OWNER has the right to file for contraction of the CITY boundaries. The OWNER will file a petition signed by the owner requesting the contraction of the municipal boundaries to exclude the PROPERTY. The matter will be scheduled before the CITY Council within forty-five (45) days after submission of the request. Should the CITY fail to approve the contraction, OWNER shall have the right to file for a Writ of Mandamus to compel the contraction along with any other available legal or equitable remedies.
- 12.2 OWNER understands and agrees that, comprehensive plan amendments are legislative functions of local government. The OWNER retains the right to challenge an action on comprehensive plan amendments in accordance with Section 163.3184, F.S. and 163.3181, F.S., and any other relevant provision of the Florida Statutes. Zoning hearings are quasijudicial. A petition for certiorari can be filed under Rule 9.100(c), Florida Rules of Appellate procedure. Relief may also be sought under Section 163.3215, F.S., and such other relief available in law and equity. The annexation agreement does not address or consider tort actions and does not constitute a request to waive sovereign immunity.
- 12.3 CITY will issue or support the issuance of impact fee credits for creditable improvements, donations, and dedications made by OWNER, or their successors and assigns, for roads, parks, schools, fire/EMS, and any other applicable impact fee. The donation will be creditable if it precedes the adoption of said fees. The value of land shall be the fair market value as required by Section 163.31801(5), F.S. CITY agrees that at no time will it impose a prohibited exaction as that term is defined in Section 70.45, F.S The City will review the cost estimate for the improvement prior to the initiation of construction. The OWNER will periodically provide invoices to the CITY as the work proceeds.
- 12.4 Any wetland impacts will be evaluated by the South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD). CITY will not be responsible for undertaking an independent wetland evaluation and CITY will not evaluate or impose any CITY wetland and wildlife mitigation requirements. OWNER will be responsible for compliance with the SFWMD, USACOE, and USFWC requirements.
- 12.5 All amendments to this Agreement must be in writing and are subject to the mutual written agreement of the PARTIES. Any waiver by either party of any provision of this Agreement must be in writing and no action shall be construed as a waiver in the absence of a written agreement of the PARTIES.

- 12.6. Jurisdiction for any litigation arising hereunder shall be with a court of competent jurisdiction located in Hendry County, Florida. In any litigation arising hereunder, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover attorney's fees and costs, including fees and costs incurred in any appeal therefrom.
- 12.7. This Agreement shall become effective on the date approved by the CITY as evidenced by the signature of the Mayor.

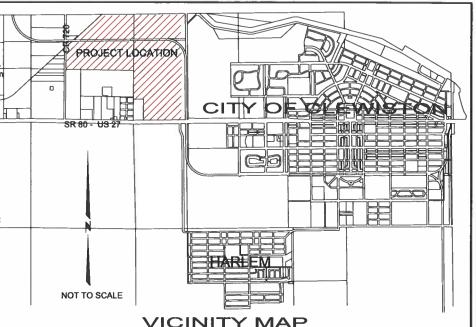

1. Background/History: Upon approval of Resolution No. 2024-055, the final reading of Ordinance No. 2024-10 will be presented. Ordinance No. 2024-10 provides for the annexation of additional territory owned by United States Sugar Corporation to be included within the city boundaries in accordance with Articles VII Section 2(c) of the Constitution of the State of Florida and Section 171.044, Florida Statutes, as amended.

United States Sugar Corporation submitted a request to be annexed into the City limits of Clewiston.

The City Planning & Zoning Board met on July 9, 2024 to review the annexation request from United States Sugar Corporation. A motion was made to approve the annexation request. The motion was passed on a voice vote with 5 ayes, 0 nays.

The City Commission approved the first reading of Ordinance No. 2024-10 on July 15, 2024 by a vote of 4-0. Commissioner Hyslope was absent.

This agenda item was tabled at the August 19, 2024 Commission Meeting to a date certain of September 16, 2024.

ORDINANCE NO. 2024-10

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF CLEWISTON, FLORIDA PROVIDING FOR THE ANNEXATION OF ADDITIONAL TERRITORY OWNED BY UNITED STATES SUGAR CORPORATION TO BE INCLUDED WITHIN THE CITY BOUNDARIES IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE VIII SECTION 2(c) OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF FLORIDA AND SECTION 171.044, FLORIDA STATUTES AS AMENDED; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the United States Sugar Corporation has submitted a petition for voluntary annexation of approximately 477 acres of contagious land, more or less, and more thoroughly described in **EXHIBIT** "A" attached hereto; and

1. Background/History: Upon approval of Resolution No. 2024-055 and Ordinance Nos. 2024-10, Ordinance No. 2024-11 will be presented. Ordinance No. 2024-11 adopts an amendment to the City's Comprehensive Development Plan in accordance with the mandates set forth in Section 163.3184, Florida Statutes, pursuant to a privately initiated application, which provides for an amendment to the City Future Land Use Map creating the Employment Hub District and re-designating five (5) parcels of real property comprising approximately 477 + acres, more or less in size, currently designated Hendry County "Multi-Use", as "Employment Hub District", such parcels of land are located North of US27 and directly West of the prior existing city boundary.

US Sugar applied for the proposed annexed property to be placed into a PUD which requires a large scale comprehensive plan.

The City Planning & Zoning Board met on July 9, 2024 to review the request from United States Sugar Corporation. A motion was made to approve the request and passed on a voice vote with 5 ayes, 0 nays.

The City Commission approved the first reading of Ordinance No. 2024-11 on July 15, 2024 by a vote of 4-0. Commissioner Hyslope was absent.

The Florida Department of Commerce reviewed the proposed comprehensive plan amendment and had no comments.

Policy 1.1.11

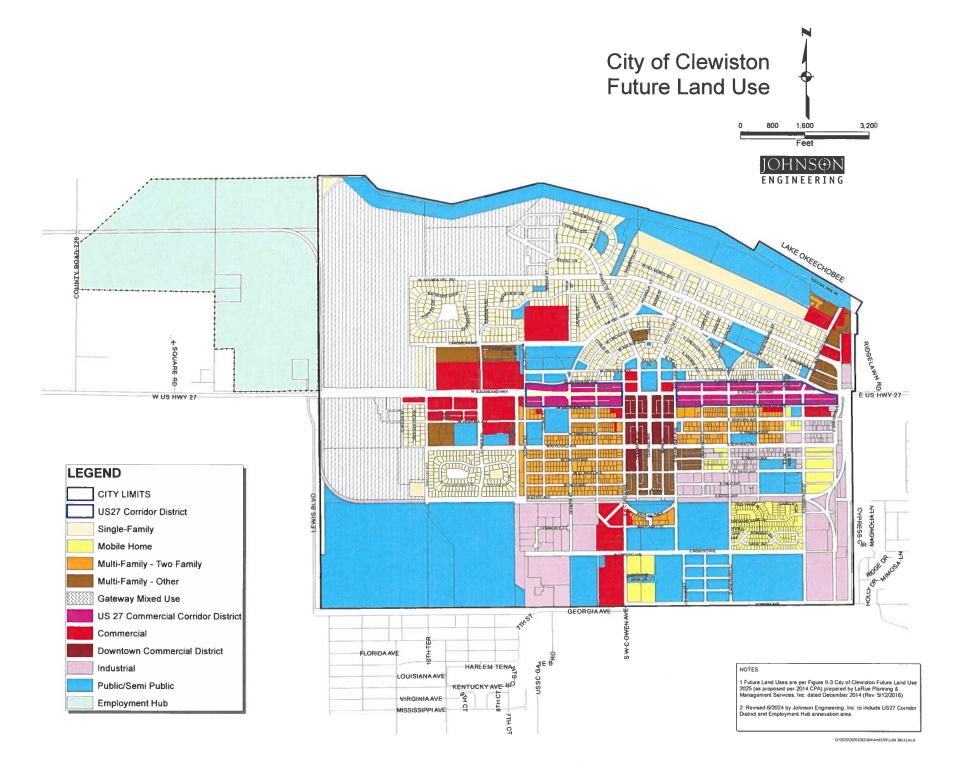
Employment Hub District: The Employment Hub District future land use category is intended to promote more development of employment-generating uses including manufacturing, warehousing and distribution, and other industrial uses as well as commercial retail and office uses.

The purpose of this category is to allow for the integration of both commercial and industrial uses and must be implemented through the PUD process. Intensity limitations in this District are as follows:

- Retail commercial 0.25 FAR.
- Office 0.50 FAR
- Industrial, including industrial/office flex space and retail showroom in industrial buildings 0.75 FAR
- SECTION 2: The City of Clewiston Comprehensive Development Plan is hereby amended by specifically changing the land use designation for five (5) parcels of real property comprising a total of approximately 477 ± acres, more or less, as more particularly described in EXHIBIT "A" to this ordinance from Hendry County "Multi-Use" to "EMPLOYMENT HUB DISTRICT" and amending the City's Future Land Use Map accordingly; which amendment consists of changing the existing map to the one (1) page map which is attached hereto as EXHIBIT "B" and made a part hereof and of the current Comprehensive Development Plan.
- **SECTION 2.** A copy of the Comprehensive Development Plan, as amended, shall be on file in the office of the City Clerk for the City of Clewiston Florida.
- **SECTION 3.** The City Manager is hereby directed to transmit one (1) copy of the amendment to the current Comprehensive Development Plan to the State Land Planning Agency along with a letter indicating the number of acres from the amendment submitted, a copy of the executed adopting ordinance and the Future Land Use Map depicting the subject property and the effective date.
- **SECTION 4.** Severability. If any section, subsection, clause or provision of this Ordinance is declared unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder shall not be affected by such invalidity.
- **SECTION 5.** Conflict. All sections or parts of sections of the revised Comprehensive Plan in conflict herewith are intended to be repealed to the extent of such conflict.

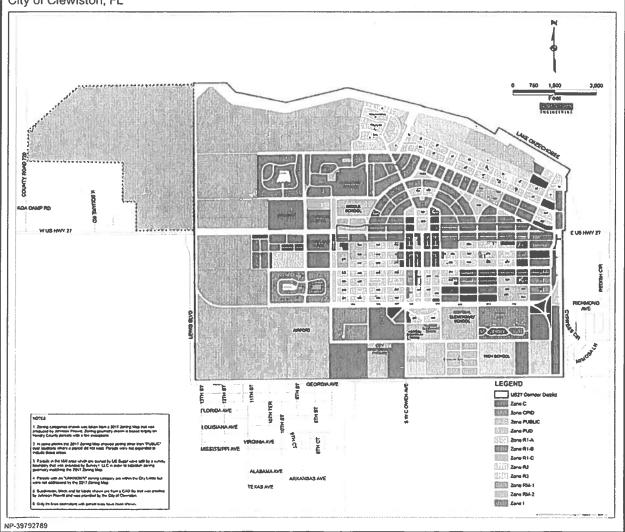

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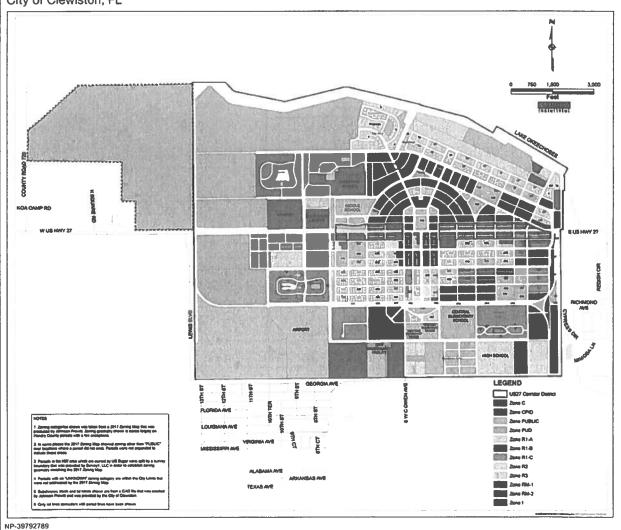

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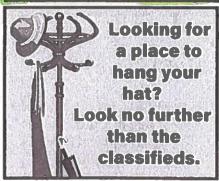

1. Background/History: Upon approval of Resolution No. 2024-055, and Ordinance Nos. 2024-10 and 2024-11, Ordinance No. 2024-12 will be presented. Ordinance No. 2024-12 provides for the rezoning of certain real property within the corporate limits of the City of Clewiston, which property consists of five parcels of land lying in Sections 7 and 8, Township 43 South, Range 34 East, Hendry County, Florida; provides that these parcels of real property shall be assigned the city zoning designation of PUD "Planned Unit Development District – Clewiston 440"; provides that the zoning map of the City of Clewiston be amended to reflect the proper designation these parcels; provides that a master concept plan for the project is hereby approved in accordance with Section 110-457 of the City of Clewiston Zoning Code.

US Sugar applied for the proposed annexed property to be placed into a PUD which requires a large scale comprehensive plan.

ORDINANCE NO. 2024-14

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF CLEWISTON, FLORIDA AMENDING THE CLEWISTON CODE OF ORDINANCES, CHAPTER 58 PEDDLERS AND SOLICITORS; CREATING ARTICLE 2. – MOBILE FOOD VENDORS; CREATING A FRAMEWORK FOR THE OPERATION OF MOBILE FOOD VENDING WITHIN THE CITY; PROVIDING FOR INCLUSION IN THE CODE OF ORDINANCES; CONFLICT; SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of Clewiston, Florida, finds that it is necessary for the proper administration of the City to provide regulations outlining the use of mobile food trucks within the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF CLEWISTON, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The Clewiston Code of Ordinances, Chapter 62, Article 2. – Mobile Food Vendors is hereby created to read as follows:

ARTICLE 2. – MOBILE FOOD VENDORS

Sec. 58-21. – Definitions.

As used in this article, the following terms shall be defined as follows:

Mobile Food Vendor shall mean any individual engaged in offering or selling products from a mobile food truck.

Mobile Food Truck shall mean any vehicle that is movable from place to place and is used to vend food and beverage products. This definition shall include 'temporary commercial kitchens' and 'mobile food dispensing vehicles' as defined under section 509.101, Florida Statutes.

Ice Cream Truck. These vehicles vend only pre-packaged frozen dairy or frozen water-based food products, soft serve or hand-dipped frozen dairy or frozen water-based food products and pre-packaged beverages. These vehicles may be classified as "mobile food dispensing vehicles," as defined by F.S. § 509.102, if they include self-contained utilities, including, but not limited to, gas, water, electricity, or liquid waste disposal.

Property Owner shall mean the owner of real property on which the mobile food vendor operates.

City-issued special event permit shall mean a permit issued by the city for special events per the requirements of chapter 10 section 45 of the City code of ordinances.

Sec. 58-22. – Requirements for Mobile Food Vendors.

The following requirements shall apply to all mobile food vendor operations within the City.

- (1) Operation. Mobile food trucks may operate on commercial or industrial zoned private property on Mondays and Tuesdays within the City. A mobile food truck shall operate only between the hours of 11:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m., unless the property owner has obtained a city-issued special event permit. A mobile food truck shall not operate on public property without an issued special event permit from the City.
- (2) Health and Safety Regulations; display of state license. All mobile food or ice cream trucks must have a valid permit issued by the State of Florida that is attached to the mobile food truck in a visible location. A copy of the annual City of Clewiston Fire Department inspection approval and a completed water/wastewater form approved by the Utilities Department are required to be submitted to the City of Clewiston prior to operating. A mobile food truck shall comply with all other federal, state, and local health and safety regulations and requirements, and shall obtain and maintain all licenses required by any other health or governmental organizations having jurisdiction over mobile food dispensing vehicles. Such licenses shall be firmly attached and visible on the mobile food truck at all times, and shall be produced to a law enforcement officer, or city code enforcement officer upon demand. All mobile food trucks shall be maintained in good repair and in a clean and sanitary condition. Routine inspections may be conducted by code enforcement officers, building code inspectors, fire inspectors, or police officers on each mobile food truck to ensure compliance with these provisions.
- (3) Food Truck Special Event Requirements. Gatherings of two or more mobile food or ice cream trucks on a property at any given time shall be classified as a food truck special event. In order for such events to occur, the property owner shall be required to obtain a city-issued special event permit prior the event taking place. Applications for special event permits shall be made by the property owner to the city in accordance with the requirements of chapter 10 section 45 of the city code of ordinances. Such special event application shall include the details of any outside seating, preparation, or storage requested by the applicant.
- (4) Consent of Property Owner. A mobile food truck shall not operate on any private property without the written consent of the property owner. A copy of such written permission shall be maintained in the mobile food or ice cream truck at all times, and shall be produced to a law enforcement officer, or city code enforcement officer upon demand.
- (5) Vending, Storage, Outside Seating. All materials, equipment, and vending shall be self-contained within the mobile food or ice cream truck unless a special event permit has

- been approved and obtained by the City. Likewise, outside seating is prohibited unless a special event permit has been approved and obtained by the city.
- (6) Conducting business near existing retail food establishments. A mobile food truck or ice cream truck shall not be located within 200 feet of any existing retail food establishment during such establishment's hours of operation without prior written permission from the retail food establishment. A copy of such written permission shall be maintained in the mobile food truck at all times, and shall be produced to a law enforcement officer, or city code enforcement officer upon demand.
- (7) Conducting business near city-sponsored or city-sanctioned special event. A mobile food or ice cream truck shall not be located within 200 feet of any city-sponsored or city-sanctioned special event, unless the mobile food truck is permitted by the city in writing to operate at such event.
- (8) Conducting business in public right-of-way & access. A mobile food truck, except for ice cream trucks, shall not conduct business or operate in the public right-of-way. Mobile food trucks nor ice cream trucks shall be parked:
 - a. In a fire lane or in an area blocking a fire hydrant.
 - b. In or blocking Americans with Disabilities (ADA) accessible parking spaces or accessible ramps.
 - c. On unimproved services (including but not limited to dire, sand, grass, gravel, or vacant lots).
 - d. In any driveway aisles, "no parking zones", or "loading only areas".
- (9) Noise Limitations. Except for Ice Cream Trucks, a mobile food truck shall not make sounds, announcements, or amplify music to call attention to its vending or products either while traveling on public or private rights of way, or when stationary. Ice Cream trucks may emit sound on arterial roads between the hours of 5:00 to 7:00 PM. All mobile food trucks including, but not limited to, class III Ice Cream Trucks, shall otherwise comply with the city's noise regulations in chapter 34 article IV of the city code of ordinances.
- (10) Waste disposal. Mobile food or ice cream trucks shall:
 - a. Provide for their own waste collection and removal such that no waste remains on property they are situated on.
 - b. Provide a waste receptable for public use.
 - c. Keep the surrounding area near and orderly at all times.
 - d. Remove all garbage or trash prior to departure of the mobile food truck each day.
 - e. Properly discard waste material in accordance with any applicable federal state, county, and municipal laws, rules, regulations, orders, or permits.
 - f. Not discharge grease or any waste materials into the stormwater system, tree pits, sidewalks, streets, parking lots, or onto any private or public property.

g. Not at any time discharge any fluids or toxic pollutants.

Sec. 58-23. – Penalties for Violations.

It shall be unlawful for any person to violate any of the provisions of this division. This division may be enforced by any means allowable by law, including, but not limited to, code enforcement citation under Florida Statute Chapter 162, and Chapter 26 Article IV of this code of ordinances or other legal action. If the citation method is used to punish violators, the violation shall be treated as a civil infraction, and fines shall be set forth in the schedule of fees and charges adopted by resolution of the City Commission as such fines may be revised from time to time by resolution; however, any fine amount set forth in such resolution of the Commission shall not exceed \$500.00 per offense. Each day a violation occurs shall constitute a separate offense and shall be punishable hereunder as a separate offense.

If any phrase, sentence or portion of this Ordinance is, for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and individual provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.
- **SECTION 4.** Repeal of Laws in Conflict. All ordinances of the City of Clewiston, Florida, which are in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.
- **SECTION 5.** Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage and consistent with all requirements of general law.

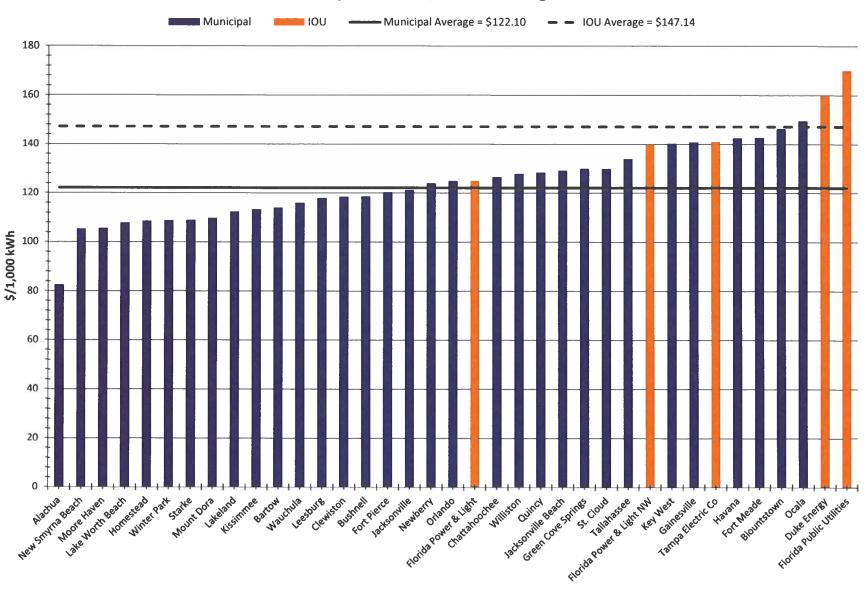
